

**CITY OF BURNABY**

**BYLAW NO.12749**

A BYLAW to set fees for property tax  
information and refunds

The Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:


1. This Bylaw may be cited as **BURNABY TAX INFORMATION AND REFUND FEES BYLAW 2009.**
2. In this Bylaw, “tax information certificate” means a statement showing
  - (a) the amount of unpaid taxes charged against specified real property,
  - (b) whether the real property has been sold for taxes, and
  - (c) if the property has been sold for taxes, the time remaining for redemption, if any, and the amount required to redeem it.
3. The City of Burnaby imposes fees as specified in Schedule “A” for the services specified in Schedule “A”.
4. Bylaw 10546, being Burnaby Tax Information Certificate Fees Bylaw 1997, is repealed.
5. This Bylaw comes into force on the first day of January, 2010.
