BYLAW NO. 12771

A BYLAW to designate the
“Swinging Girl” neon sign as a
protected heritage property

WHEREAS the “Swinging Girl” neon sign (hereinafter called the “Sign”) is located on and attached to the City owned parcel of land adjacent to 4142 Hastings Street and having the legal description: Parcel Identifier: 014-153-912, Parcel “F” (Plan with Bylaw Filed 29018) of Lot 9, Block 9, District Lot 121, Group 1, New Westminster District, Plan 1054 (hereinafter called the “Lands”);

AND WHEREAS Council considers that the Sign, which was built in 1956 and originally installed on the exterior of the building at 4142 East Hastings Street where it remained for over 50 years and became a landmark of the local “Heights” business area, and is one of the best surviving examples of Kinetic neon art in British Columbia, has heritage value and heritage character and that designation of the Sign pursuant to section 967 of the *Local Government Act* is necessary or desirable for its conservation;

AND WHEREAS the City is the owner of the Lands;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This BYLAW may be cited as **BURNABY HERITAGE DESIGNATION BYLAW NO. 1, 2010.**

2. Council hereby designates the Sign as protected heritage property under section 967 of the *Local Government Act*.
