Byrne Brine Still & McHernott

The minutes of last
meeting were read and approved

Tenders for the
protection work of the Brunette Bridge were opened
Gillanders \$192⁵ + Stride \$120⁵ and it was
moved by Councillor Byrne see by Councillor McHernott
and resolved that the Committee be given
Stride

The Reeve reported that he with
some of the Council had last Tuesday gone
to interview Mr Brunchley on his place
and that after discussing the matter he
Brunchley had agreed to accept \$50⁰⁰ in settlement
of any claim he might have against the
Corporation Mr Brunchley who was present was
allowed to address the Council and he stated
that his Bro - whom he had seen since would
not agree to the settlement as proposed It
was then moved by Councillor Brine see by Councillor
Byrne and Resolved that the Reeve be
authorized to attend to this matter and
take what measures he may think
necessary to settle the dispute Mr Brunchley
asked the Council what they intended to
have done as to clearing out the Culvert
and ditch on the road running past
his land and it was moved by Councillor
Still see by Councillor McHernott and
Resolved that Councillor Brine & Stride
be empowered to let a contract

not to exceed \$20- to have the
desired work done also to have
about $\frac{1}{2}$ chain 12 feet corduroy
placed where needed on Far N.
opposite Branchley's It was resolved
Fernand be paid \$10- at his costs
also Levi Morris be paid \$5-

On motion
of Conne Byrne see by Conne Hill
it was resolved that the consideration
of Mr Marshall's ^{act} contract be laid
over till next meeting

The Clerk
was instructed to ascertain from
Archie McGovin if he was willing to
complete his Contract for
corduroying on Cumberland road
It was moved by Conne Hill see
by Conne Byrne and resolved
that the Clerk notify the
N.W.T.B. Telephone Company to
move their poles on Douglas road
On motion by Conne Byrne see
by Conne ^{McG} Resolved that the
weekly payroll was ordered to be paid
In the matter of the construction
of a bridge on the North arm road
close to the western boundary
of the district The Clerk was
instructed to have an advertisement
inserted in the weekly Columbian
inviting tenders to be in not later
than 1st June

Mr Aley Phillips
claim against the Corporation

was then taken up for consideration
and after the matter had been fully gone
into it was resolved that \$56⁶⁵ be
considered by this Council as a fair
amount to be paid to Mr. A. E. Philip in
full satisfaction of any claim he may
have and that it be referred our
solicitor for his opinion.

It was resolved
that George Hardys Bill⁴ = Lesser Love⁴⁵
and Brit Columbian \$30²⁵ be paid
The Clerk was instructed to write to
the Provincial Secretary about the
\$1000. Govt grant.
