at next meeting of the Council

It was resolved that tenders be invited by
notice put up at Comr Strides,
The Boundary and Pleistis for the
making of the following described pieces
of roads viz about 10 chains on east side
of central park from the Van^e road south
and about 16 chains south side of lot 32
from the Van^e road west — The roadway
to be 20^{ft} wide and graded
for a width of 12ft.

Saturday the 8th inst at 3 o'clock in the
afternoon
