The Council met at 3 p.m. in room 1  
Masonic block New Westminster City  
The Reeve and all the Councillors  
were present

The minutes of meeting

Louis Claude Dies report in the matter of the logs in Burnaby lake was read and it was moved by Councill Byrne & seconded by Councill Smith & resolved that Evans Coleman Evans be written to in the matter of the damage from overflow from Burnaby lake caused by their logs in the lake and informed that it was necessary this should be attended to without delay and some action taken to remedy the evil complained of.

The consideration of communication from Herbert Gilley & others was laid over.

It was moved by Councill Byrne & seconded by Councill Smith & resolved that so many of the Council as possible start at 8 o'clock A.M. of Wednesday next to view some of the roads & improvements needed and so on.

Communication from Chf. Comr. of L & L was read this stated that the Govt had been pleased to grant \$1000. to this municipality to aid in the construction of a road along the Western boundary of this District from the False Creek road on the south to the Hastings road on the north.

9 March 1875

Mrs. Wiggle & Mackow who were present  
were heard advocating the construction of this  
road. It was moved by Councillor Byrne  
seconded by Councillor Sprott and resolved that we  
are in favor of this road being made and  
it was moved by Councillor Sprott seconded by Councillor  
Byrne resolved that Mr. Hazyard be  
authorized to hire 2 men and clear out the  
line of the proposed road planting slopes  
thereon every quarter of a mile.

Statute Laborers By-Law was read and  
passed in first reading.

It was moved by Councillor Smith seconded  
by Councillor Byrne and resolved that Councillor  
Sprott be empowered to offer Joseph Wintimate  
\$-40 per cubic yard for gravel hauled and  
spread on the road as directed.

It was moved  
by Councillor Sprott seconded by Councillor Byrne  
and resolved that any seller who wishes to do  
so can break up stone on some spot handy  
to a road no pieces to be too large to pass  
through a 2½ inch ring. The Council  
agreeing to pay for same at the rate of \$1.50  
per cubic yard.

The Council then  
adjourned to meet again in same  
place on Saturday 23 inst at  
8 o'clock p.m.
