All the Members of the Council  
were present

The minutes of the last meeting <sup>final</sup>  
were read and adopted

The Recr read an  
invitation he had ~~from the Recr~~ received  
from the Rev Westminster City Clerk for  
the Recr and Councilors to be present  
at the Exhibition of the R.A. & I Society  
from the 6<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> Oct — and it was  
resolved that the Clerk be instructed  
to reply accepting the invitation with  
thanks.

A Communication from Mr O Lewis  
in the matter of the Blood Relief fund  
still on hand was read and on motion  
Received & filed

Counc Robertson presented Plans &  
Specifications for rebuilding the York  
bridge on the North Arm road  
and it was resolved that the tenders to  
do this work be invited by Advertising  
once each in the Columbian World  
Tenders to be in not later than 2 p.m.

Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> Oct next and marked tenders  
for York bridge

Counc Stride Reported that he has  
in conformity with resolutions passed at  
last meeting of the Council let a  
Contract to Mr Bro Burgess to haul onto  
the Vancouver road 150 yds or more gravel  
for 29 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents per yard

The Reeve reported that he had noticed two dead trees alongside the Vancouver & Coquitlam Stride agreed to attend to having them removed.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Council of the Municipality of Coquitlam calling their attention to the large trees alongside the Brunette river bridge and North road and request them to join with this Council in having the same removed.

Comr Spott reported that he had under Authority given him at last meeting of this Council - let a contract to W. J. Leach to cut the brush on the Hastings road. From Powlan's Camp to the Boundary & the report was adopted.

The Reeve reported that he had written to Dr. Walt See Prov Board of Health in the matter of the benefit to the health of those living near the bank of the Fraser River which would follow from having the river dyked. A communication from Annie S. Walmsley widow, was read and it was resolved that \$10 be granted her for the purpose of paying her rent.

A communication from Mr. J. G. Johnson Secy enclosing blank forms of Petitions Anti Japanese & Anti Chinese was read and it was resolved that the Petitions be signed and the Corporate Seal applied thereto as requested by him.

Council Robertson was authorized to have about 4 chairs of Corduroy on the Byrne & New Wiggins roads replaced the same having been burned through the last fire's Course Spruth was authorized to hire Mr L C Hill with team for 3 1/2 days to haul gravel also to clean out ditches near Whiting's on the Hastings road

The Council then Adjourned to meet again in the same place on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> Oct next at 2 o'clock in the afternoon
