The Council met in the Clerk's Office  
New Westminster City on Saturday 18  
Sept 1897 at 2-30 p.m.

All the members of the Council were  
present

The minutes of last meeting & init  
were read and adopted

Council Spott reported that he had let a  
contract for cutting off the brush on the  
Hastings road between Slick creek hill and  
the bottom of Welsh hill to Throssell & Burgess  
for \$45- and the report on motion was  
received and adopted

The tenders received for cutting the brush  
on the Westminster Vancouver road were  
then opened and considered and contracts  
awarded to Del Ford & Franklin from  
Boundary road to Royal Oak for \$12-  
and to Throssell & Burgess from Royal  
Oak to Tramway track for \$45-

The Council then discussed the  
estimate of the Am't to be expended in  
the different wards together with the  
amounts which have already been spent  
out of this year's Revenue.

It was considered advisable to spend  
further in Ward I \$5-50- in Ward II \$600  
in Ward III \$100- in Ward IV \$5-50- in  
Ward F

It was resolved that tenders be invited  
by Advt in next Monday's Columbian  
for furnishing laying a lot drain or 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Avenue Specifications to be seen at  
Crown cliff and tenders to be in before

18 Sept 1899

of per 24 inch

It was Resolved that Reeve Schon  
and Councillors Spott & Ledger be  
appointed as a Committee to view  
the Hastings road as to repairs  
needed and report at next meeting  
also that Councils Stride & Criddle  
be a Committee on the Vancouver  
road and report at next meeting.  
The Clerk was instructed to write  
to the City Clerk of New Westminster  
accepting on behalf of this Council  
the invitation to be present at the  
Royal Agricultural and Industrial  
Exhibition from the 5<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup>  
October 1899.

The consideration of Mr Aulay,  
Morrison Kies and a communication  
from Mr Jno Woodlands were deferred  
till next meeting of the Council.  
The Council then adjourned  
till Friday 24 inst at 9 pm.
