The Council met in house, 356, 12<sup>th</sup> st. New Westminster City, on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1898 at 7 p.m.

All the members of the Council were present.

The minutes of last meeting 1<sup>st</sup> inst. were read and adopted.

Coun. Byrne reported, that he considered the bridge on the Hastings road, near Still creek, safe as it did not shake at all and had not settled, but after some discussion it was moved by Coun. Byrne seconded by Coun. Stride and resolved that Coun. Sprott be authorized to have a guard rail firmly bolted on each side of the bridge.

The tenders received for making about 25 chs. Deer Lake road were then opened and the tender of Fred. Throssell to make the road according to specifications for \$1.70 per chain, was, on motion of Couns. Byrne & Stride, accepted.

Coun. Byrne reported that some of the roadway on the Wiggins road had been burnt, and

Coun. Sprott reported that Mr. Rae, Reeve of South Vancouver, complained that the bridge on the Boundary road built by L. Farrand was not in good condition, & it was resolved that the consideration of the burnt roadway be deferred & that Couns. Byrne & Stride be allowed to spend a sum not exceeding \$20 on the Boundary r. bridge.

The Council then adjourned to meet again in the same place on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> inst. at 7 p.m.
