The Council met in the clerks office New Westminster on Saturday 8th Jan 1898 at 2 p.m.

Present Reeve Schow in the chair and Councillors Cliff Cridland Sprott Stride

Minutes.
The minutes of last meeting ^{to} which were read and adopted

Coune Stride reported that he had employed a man and team to do some repairs needed on the Vancouver road but that owing to bad weather no work had been done

A communication from Mr J Bentzen Manager of B.C Electric Railway co was read - this was a complaint that the Electric lights outside the Company's station building at Central Park were being smashed and asking protection for its Company's property. And it was moved by Coune Cliff seconded by Coune Sprott Resolved that \$5 reward be offered to anyone who will furnish such evidence as will lead to the conviction of any one who injures the property of the B.C Electric Ry at Central Park and that notice of this offered reward be posted up

The Auditors Report was taken up for consideration and the clerk was instructed to have 500 copies printed & exhibit the statement so required by Law - Coune Sprott reported that about a chain more of Corduroy

was needed on the Hastings road, and it was moved by Councillor Cudland & seconded by Councillor Stride resolved that Councillor Sprott be authorized to have the needed Corduroy put on the Hastings road.

It was moved by Councillor Sprott & seconded by Councillor Stride & Resolved that whereas a Receipt was given by the Collector to the Solicitor for Taxes due by John Ross Bishop and whereas said taxes were paid into the Bank of Montreal to the credit of current account instead of being paid to the Collector.

Now therefore the Collector is authorized and instructed to enter the said taxes as paid on his Collector's roll and the same shall be his authority for doing the same.

It was moved by Councillor Cliff & seconded by Councillor Sprott & Resolved that the Collector be authorized and instructed to procure an auxiliary ledger and enter up therein A all the mortgages held by the Council for Sinking funds invested B. All the amount of Interest due and accruing due and that have been paid thereon in proper order.
