

The Council met on Saturday  
18<sup>th</sup> August 1900 at 2.45 p.m. in  
municipal hall.

Present; Reeve Dehan in the Chair and  
a full Council.

The minutes of last Meeting, were read,  
and were, on motion, adopted.

Communications were read from J. Davis,  
E. Matheson, W. H. Deery and the North  
Pacific Lumber Co. and were ordered  
to be received & filed.

Tenders were opened for replanking  
and repairing Bridge on North road  
and were read as follows:-

J. I. Wintemute, \$9<sup>50</sup> and \$2<sup>50</sup> per day for  
other work required.

F. Thruswell, \$20<sup>00</sup> and 7c. per lineal  
foot for all new timbers.

P. M. Nicholson \$17<sup>25</sup>/<sub>100</sub> and 5c. per ft. for new  
timbers + \$2<sup>00</sup> per day for adzing  
off stringers if required.

It was moved & seconded by Louis Byrne  
and Cliff and resolved that Mr. Wintemute's  
tender be accepted.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the  
Japanese Consul, stating that the  
Council will be compelled to take  
steps to procecute Japs if they continue  
to labor on Sundays, but it is hoped  
that by timely warning they can be persuaded

to desist from pursuing their daily work on the Sabbath.

A petition was read from Resident & Taxpayers in the vicinity of Central Park requesting the institution of a Pound By-law within specified limitations.

It was moved and seconded by Couns. Byrne and Spratt & resolved that the Petition be received and a By-law prepared.

Coun. Spratt gave notice that at the next meeting he would introduce a Pound By-law, and also a municipal electors' By-law.

Counc. Spratt was empowered to award contracts for brushing out Royal oak and Hastings roads, and Coun. Smith to award contracts for brushing out Bannet and North roads, and the Clerk was instructed to advertise same in the Province & Columbian.

Coun. Byrne reported re A. Speck's application for repairs on Booth road, and suggested that the ditch be deepened for about 4 chains, on motion the report was received & adopted.

The meeting adjourned till Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> Sept: at 2.30 pm.
