

The Council met on Monday,  
19<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1900 at 2.30 p.m. in Municipal  
Hall.

Present:-

Reverend Schaw in the Chair and Counc.  
Byrne, Storde, Smith & Spott.

The minutes of last meeting were  
read & were, on motion, adopted.

The time for receiving tenders for  
the Mc Kay road extension, for  
screened gravel for Vancouver rd,  
& for Corduroy for Royal oak rd. was  
extended until next meeting.

Coun. Byrne submitted a specification  
for the extension of the McKay Road  
and it was on motion resolved that said  
extension be 24 ft. in width, in  
compliance with the petition presented  
at previous meeting, inasmuch as  
this reservation was accepted in 1897,  
and previously to the passing of the  
resolution that no road reservations  
be accepted for a less width than 33 feet.

The report re Wintemuse's road was  
deferred till next meeting.

Coun. Storde reported re Swains  
application for road repairs, and was  
authorized to have the ditch cleaned  
out so as to carry off the water.

Mr. Bond's application for a road into Lot 32, Couns. Stude & Sprout were appointed a Committee with power to accept Mr. Bond's offer to construct the road for the sum of forty dollars, work to be done to the satisfaction of the Council.

Coun. Sprout reported that he had received tenders for gravel for Stastings road, & A. G. Stevens' offer of 65¢ per yard, being the lowest, was accepted. He also reported that being unable to secure the balance of Stewart's rock he had arranged to accept another fifty yards of gravel instead. Report received & adopted.

Mr. J. W. West's bills of costs for legal charges were taken up and a cheque ordered to be drawn for \$3<sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub>, and the Clerk was instructed to state that the Council was of the opinion that the costs of the action on the complaint of J. Mayne should be charged to the Complainant.

Mr. H. A. Eastman was permitted to address the Council and applied, on behalf of purchasers of the Flood property, for construction of roads through Lots 10 & 14 to connect with the Johnston & North Roads. The matter was referred to a Committee of the whole Council, and at the next meeting a date to be fixed when the Committee will go over the ground & make

an inspection.

Couns. Smith & Stride were requested to interview Mr. J. Sprout, Govt. road inspector, for the purpose of ascertaining the true lines of the Vancouver Rd. between the power house & the Royal Oak.

The Collector's request to be relieved from attendance at the Hall on Wednesdays & Fridays was granted, until further notice.

The Reeve reported that he had amended the distribution of prizes of the Richmond Farmer's Institute and had presented the Council's prize to Joyce & Dunmore who had been awarded the same by the judges.

The Council adjourned to meet on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> Dec: next at 1 pm.
