

The Council met on Saturday 27 Oct.
at 2.40 p.m. in Municipal Hall

Present:-

Reverend Schow in the Chair & a full Council.

The Minutes of last meeting were read &
were on motion approved.

Coun. Smith reported re log chute across
Barnet road and submitted a draft
of agreement, which the Clerk was
instructed to forward to the Canadian
Pacific Lumber Co. for their signature.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the
Corporation Solicitors re confirmation
of tax sale.

On motion it was resolved that the consideration of the Pound by-law be not proceeded with, as the counter petition was largely signed by supporters of the original petition, requesting the passing of the by-law.

Coun. Byrne gave notice that at the next meeting he would move that fence viewers be appointed.

The Constable's report was read, and also a communication from J. W. West, enclosing bills for legal charges in connection with the prosecution of Chummen for theft. The same were ordered to be received & filed.

On motion, it was resolved that the services of Constable Cook be dispensed with, he having been appointed for the special purpose of suppressing the lawlessness of undesirable visitors from the neighboring cities during the summer time, and the season is so far advanced that there is no pressing need for police protection.

A communication was read from the Richmond Farmers Institute stating that the prizes for the plot competition will be awarded on 17th Nov. The communication was received & filed, and the Deere was requested to be present on that occasion and award the Council's prize to the winner thereof.

A communication was read from Logue & Lamoureux re North Road, & was received & filed.

Coun. Cliff was instructed to open out the temporary road around the unsafe bridge on the North Road,

and to block the approaches to the bridge.

A Communication was read from D. Bond requesting a road into Lot 52. Referred to Coun. Stride to report.

A petition was read from residents of Ladysmith, Lot 97, requesting a road, and was laid over till next meeting.

A largely signed petition was read requesting extension of Mr. Kay Road. Referred to Ann. Byrne to report at next meeting.

On motion it was resolved that in future no road reservation be accepted for a less width than 33 feet.
