Present, Reeve Johnson and a full Council.

The minutes of last meeting were read and on motion adopted.

It was moved and seconded (by Councillors. Stride and Byrne) and resolved that the Clerk be directed to write to the Electric Tram Co^y requiring the roadway opposite North Road near the city limit to be levelled off to the satisfaction of the Council, and stating that in the meantime the Corporation of Burnley will not be responsible for any accident that might occur while the road is in its present condition.

Mr. Ross and Bro^s letter promising to have the old slaughter houses near Central Park secured against the entrance and harbouring of tramps was read and deemed satisfactory and the Clerk was instructed to reply to that effect.

It was moved and seconded (by Councillors. Smith and Spott) that the Clerk write to Mr. E. Parkins on requiring him to remove obstructions in ditch near his premises, and to make the Boulevard as it was before he altered it and stating further in letter that the Council will not be responsible for damage meanwhile done to adjacent properties by reason of water overflowing

Communications were received from Messrs H. Cantler and Thomas Brocklebank complaining of various drains and culverts having been blocked up, causing an inundation detrimental to their several properties.

It was moved by Counc. Molt, seconded by Counc. Byrne and resolved that the Council meet at 10 o'clock on Friday 22nd inst. at Central Park to inspect water courses.

Counc. Love reported that ditch near Mr Allen's on 6th Street requires deepening.

It was moved and seconded by Counc. Byrne and Hilde and resolved that Counc. Love be authorized to get necessary work done on said ditch.

Moved by Counc. Byrne, seconded by Counc. Love that new tenders be called for North Elm Road Contract. Carried.

Mr Geo. Bulmann's tender of \$6⁰⁰ per chain for Royal Oak Road Contract was accepted.

Mr J. Kennell's tender of \$35⁰⁰ and 25 per foot for culverts on South Street Contract was accepted conditional on Mr Milomite first laying brush one foot in depth on the road, and the contractor to cover the same with earth as part of the contract for which he had tendered, and it was moved and seconded by Counc. Smith and Byrne and resolved that Counc. Love be empowered to let the contract to Mr Kennell subject to foregoing conditions.

Counc. Smith reported that the Barnet Road and other highways in his ward would require some repairs and that he would give details at an early date.

The Clerk was directed to look up on the Minutes and have ready for reference at next meeting a resolution making an allowance of ten dollars extra for burning on Sec. 14 of Tancumber Road Improvement Extension.

Moved by Cunnis, Byrne and Mills and resolved that the Clerk be directed to write to Contractors working on Tancumber Road Improvements, both side notifying them that no wood or rubbish must be used to fill up ditches.

The Clerk was directed to send a letter of condolence on behalf of Council to Mrs S. C. M. Doekrill sympathizing with her in the death of her husband.

Council adjourned until 2.15 P.M. Saturday 30th November, and being the last of the month, resolved to make payments of accounts on that day.
