

The Council met on Saturday
20th July at 7 P.M. in the Municipal Hall

Present.

Reeve Schou in the Chair & a full Council

The Minutes of last meeting were read
and on motion adopted.

A communication was received
from the New Westminster City Council
agreeing to bear one half of the expense of
contemplated improvements along
First Avenue of Burnaby and the
City boundary near ^{the} First Street. The
Clerk was directed to write thanking
the City Corporation for cooperating
with Burnaby in the matter. Councillor
Love to report with specifications at next
meeting.

Councillor Stride reported that C. Dunn
had removed obstructions complained
of on Wise Road.

A letter from the Corporation soliciting
the Dockill re locating North Road
was received and filed.

Tenders were received from Messrs.
George & Albert and A. L. Schibald for
work on North Road, making repairs to
bridge and banking gravel. After some
discussion, it was decided that the gravel
should also be spread, and that the Clerk
write to Coquitlam Council asking
whether that Council is willing to bear
half of the expense of work as now
suggested, which exceeds their limit of

seventy dollars on the whole cost of
Contract, or whether an expenditure
of fifteen dollars on the bridge and a
hundred yards only of gravel to be
hauled and spread, would be more in
consonance with the wishes of
Coquitlam.

Councillor Stride reported having
ordered Thistles to be cut near Electric
Power House.

Moved by Counc. Smith, seconded by
Counc. Spratt that Electric Lum Comp^y
be asked to cut Thistles on their property
adjoining. Counc. Stride to act.

Moved by Counc. Smith, seconded by
Counc. Spratt that Counc. Byrne draw
up specifications for widening the
Jubilee Road, North and South and
PR - also for ^{the} laying curbs on the Byrne
road. Specifications for the former to
be seen at Mr Parkinsons, Central
Park, and for the latter at Mr Woodlands,
North Burn Road.

Moved Counc. Byrne, seconded by
Counc. Spratt, that Tenders be called
for the above works through advertisements
in the Columbian & Provincial newspapers.
A communication was read from
Mr J. Davies re Tramway Crossing
near his property. Moved by Counc. Smith
seconded by Counc. Love, that the Clerk write
Mr Davies, that work is incomplete
yet, and will be found satisfactory
when finished.
