Small Holdings.

A communication was read from the Dept. of Lands & Works stating that the Lessee of the Govt. Lots on Johnston road objects very strongly against their being divided into small holdings as it would be impossible for him to get the timber off within two years.

The Clerk was instructed to reply.

Govt. Sale of lands in Bunnah for unpaid taxes.

A letter from the Surveyor of Taxes to the Clerk was read, agreeing to accept half the amount due for taxes on Lot 120 plus his expenses (5<sup>25</sup>). Land over.

The Clerk reported he had conferred with the Collector who was empowered to deal with him in the matter of the whole of the taxes unpaid, and that he had supplied him with the whole of the information in his possession, and that a preliminary agreement had been reached:-

1. That the lands in Bunnah should be withdrawn from the Sale.
2. That the Collector should receive as much as he was able of the amounts due and
3. That the balance should be transferred to the Council for the amount named in the Surveyor's letter, including Lot 120.

The Clerk also reported he had seen Mr Morgan the agent of the purchasers of Lot 120 who bought it "for the taxes", and that it was probable they would meet the Council in the matter. Land over.
