3 A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal
4 Hall on Monday, September 10th. 1914, at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

5 Present:- His worship Reeve Fraser.

6 Councillors Somas, Webb, Ward, Van Vel, Mulgrew, and Murray.
7 Moved by Cr. Van Vel, Seconded by Cr. Webb:- "That the Minutes of

9 confirmed."

11 Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:-

13 issuance of a Permit should properly be kept in the hands
14 of this Corporation."

16 received and filed, and that the required Permit be granted."
Councillors Mulgrew, Somas, Ward and Murray voted in favour,
and Councillors Van Vel and Webb voted against.

- 8 4. That permission be granted to Mr. J. W. Grath to instal a
9 Gasoline Tank and Pumps, on the boulevard at Kinsway
10 and Smith Avenue.
- 11 5. That permission be granted to Mr. R. A. Smith to erect 2
12 or more poles (temporary) on Portland Street, for telephone
13 purposes
- 14 6. That Spratt Street be improved, at an estimated cost
15 of \$ 150.
- 16 7. That F. Atkinson, Roller Engineers, be paid at the rate
17 of \$ 4.00 per. day.
