3 A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal  
4 Hall on Monday - July 8th. 1918, at 7.45 O'clock, p.m.  
5 Present:- His worship Reeve Fraser.

6 Councillors Richmond, Webb, Ward, Edgar and Murray.  
7 Moved by Cr. Webb, Seconded by Cr. Richmond:- That the  
8 Minutes of the Meeting of June 24th. ult., be adopted as  
9 written and confirmed.

10 Carried unanimously.

11 Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-  
12 Secretary - U.B.C.M. - Notice of date of Convention at Victoria  
13 on 18th to 20th. September next.

14 Moved by Cr. Webb, Seconded by Cr. Edgar:- That the letter  
15 be received and filed, and that the appointment of  
16 delegates be left to the Reeve.

17 Carried unanimously.

18 The Reeve called attention to the forthcoming convention at  
19 Victoria, of the Union of Canadian Municipalities.

20 Moved by Cr. Webb, Seconded by Cr. Richmond:- That the  
21 Clerk and the Treasurer be authorised to attend this  
22 Convention.

23 Carried unanimously.

24 From the Provincial Secretary - re. Central Park, Park Board,  
25 advising that the late members of this Board had resigned,  
26 and asking for the names of two persons resident in Burnaby  
27 to be submitted for appointment as members of the Board.  
28 The Reeve suggested that this matter might lay over  
29 pending the outcome of certain arrangements to which he  
30 referred.

31 Moved by Cr. Webb, Seconded by Cr. Richmond:- That this  
32 matter lay over.

33 Carried unanimously.

34 The District Registrar of Titles re. Special Survey No. 1., advising  
35 that the Plans of D.L. 19, D.L. 50, and D.L. 55, together  
36 with the Order-in-Council approving the Special Survey,  
37 have been registered in the Land Registry Office at New  
38 Westminster.

39 Moved by Cr. Webb, Seconded by Cr. Murray:- That the letter be  
40 received and filed, and that the Special Assessment in  
41 connection with Special Survey, No. 1., be made in due course.

42 Carried unanimously.

43 Solicitors - re. Case of Feeble-minded, advising that no special

provision for such cases appears on the Statutes, and recommending that the matter be submitted to the Union of B. C. Municipalities for consideration at the forthcoming Convention.

Moved by Mr. Webb, Seconded by Mr. Murray: - That the letter be received and filed, and the recommendation of the Corporation Solicitor, be adopted:

Carried unanimously.

General Manager, B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd., re. Strike of Railway Employees, advising that it would not be possible for the Company to accede to the demands of its employees and continue in operation, unless the fares on the system be increased. Councillor Webb, asked permission to retire, while this letter was under discussion. - Agreed.

Councillor Webb thereupon vacated his seat.

After some discussion it was

Moved by Mr. Murray, Seconded by Mr. Richmond: - That this letter lay over for further consideration.

Carried unanimously.

The Reeve suggested that it be intimated to the officials of the B. C. Ry. Co. that this Council would be pleased to meet them at the Municipal Hall to discuss any matters in the Agreement presently existing between the company and this Corporation. This was agreed to.

Councillor Webb resumed his seat.

Finance Committee Report : - Your Committee met on July 2nd, 1918, and recommend:-

1. That General Accounts, amounting to \$4509, be paid.
2. That Wages, amounting to \$160.55, be paid.
3. That the Credit Bureau, Vancouver Medical Association, be advised that this Corporation do not admit any liability with reference to Dr. Broadb's Ac. vs. Mr. A. Richards \$4.50.
4. That the Salary of G. Baldwin, Pumping Engineer, be increased to \$100 per. month, as from July 1st. inst.
5. That the Wages of Employees be \$3.50 per. day of 8 hours, with a 44 hour week, as from July 1st. inst.
6. That the Wages of Water Inspectors be \$5.50 per. day, straight time, as from July 1st. inst.
7. That the Salary of R. Stevens be \$95 per. month, as from July 1st. inst.
8. That the Salary of Wm. Brown, auto-truck driver, be \$60 per. month.

Q. That the Rebate of 12% per damp per night, offered by the B. L. & R. Ry. Co., on account of the operation of the Daylight Saving Act, be accepted.

Moved by Dr. Webb, Seconded by Dr. Richmond: "That the Report of the Finance Committee be adopted." Carried unanimously.

  3. That a Water Service be laid to Lot 5, Blk. 2. S. E. 88 1/2 / 91. C. F. Lueken - at an estimated cost of \$95.  
Note:- Labour furnished by applicant.
  4. That a Water Service be laid to Lot 4. Blk. 6. D. S. 85 - 4. Johnson - at an estimated cost of \$88.
  5. That a Water Service be laid to Lots 15 + 16, Blk. 1. S. E. 149. H. Boyd - at an estimated cost of \$40.

12 the Engineer, to report.

21 Slaughter House By-Law, 1893, Repealing By-Law, 1918, be  
22 introduced and read a first time."

Carried unanimously.

23 Moved by Mr. Webb, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - "That the Burnaby  
24 Slaughter House By-Law, 1893, Repealing By-Law, 1918, do pass  
25 the First Reading."

Carried unanimously.

26 Moved by Mr. Ward, Seconded by Mr. Webb: - "That the Burnaby  
27 Slaughter House By-Law, 1893, Repealing By-Law, 1918, be read  
28 a Second time."

Carried unanimously.

29 Moved by Mr. Webb, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - "That the Burnaby

32 The Reeve reported verbally with reference to his attendance  
33 at two meetings held in the office of the Mayor of Vancouver,  
34 when matters relating to the strike of B.C.E.Ry. employees  
35 and its effect on Municipalities, were discussed.

36 The Reeve handed in a letter to himself, from the General  
37 Manager of the B.C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd., which was

1 The letter was dated July 4th. inst., and was accompanied  
2 by a copy of a letter from the writer to the Mayor of Vancouver.  
3 The visitor asked that this Council would pass a By-Law  
4 authorizing such changes in the Agreement as to enable the  
5 Company to charge a fare not exceeding six cents for riding  
6 any distance on the Company's present street railway system  
7 in Burnaby, and a fare not exceeding seven cents for such  
8 ride, together with transfer privilege on the Company's street  
9 railway lines in Vancouver.

10 The writer also stated that the special arrangements as to  
11 reduction of fares on the Burnaley Lake line, and on District  
12 No. 1. line, will be abandoned.

13 Moved by Br. Murray, Seconded by Br. Edgar:—"That the  
14 correspondence lay over."

Carried unanimously.

16 Moved by Mr. Webb, Seconded by Mr. Richmond: "That this
