

Monday December 10th. 1920

A Regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, December 10th. 1920, at 4.30 p.m.

Present:- His worship Reeve Sanderson.

Councillors Mr. Dean, Coldicutt, Rummel, White, Lawson and Russell.

Moved by Cr. Lawson, Seconded by Cr. Coldicutt:- "That the Minutes of the Meeting of December 6th. 1920, be adopted as written and confirmed.

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-

1. Secretary School Board re. Sale of School Site - part of Block I. D. L. 131, acknowledging receipt of advice as to value.

Moved by Cr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Cr. Rummel:- "That the letter be received and filed.

Carried unanimously.

2. Secretary, U. B. C. M. re. Taxation - asking that the views and suggestions of this Council be sent to Mr. F. A. McDiarmid, on or before December 31st inst.

Moved by Cr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Cr. Lawson:- "That this be referred to the Reeve, with the Treasurer and the Clerk, to consider and report."

Carried unanimously.

3. Mr. F. Kohler - withdrawing application for liquor license.

3. The Board of School Trustees attended and addressed the Council with reference to their request for the consideration of a Supplementary Estimate of Extra ordinary expenditure.
Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That Thursday December 2nd. inst., at 4 O'clock in the afternoon, be set as the day and hour when this Council will receive and consider a Supplementary Estimate of Extra-ordinary expenditure, from the Board of School Trustees."
Carried unanimously.
4. Moved by Mr. McLean, Seconded by Mr. Russell: - "That the Estimate for providing an Auxiliary Water main, and for improving and extending the present Water System, be submitted to, and considered by, this Council on Thursday, December 2nd. inst."
Carried unanimously.
5. Mr. White read a letter from W. Watson, complaining that the Street Light on Boldom Ave. has not been burning for several nights.
Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. White: - "That a copy of the letter be sent to the P.C.B. Ry. Co."
Carried unanimously.
6. Moved by Mr. Lawson, Seconded by Mr. White: - "That the meetings of Committees be held as usual on Monday, December 24th. inst."
Carried unanimously.
7. Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Russell: - "That the matter of a holiday on Monday, December 24th. inst., be left to the Reeve."
Carried unanimously.
8. Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. McLean: - "That this Council do now adjourn until Thursday, December 24th. inst., at 4 O'clock p.m."
