

Monday January 3rd. 1951.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, January 3rd. 1951, at 4.30 p.m.
Present:- His worship Reeve Sanderson.

Councillors McLean, Coldicutt, Rummel, White, Lawson and Russell.

Moved by Mr. Lawson, Seconded by Mr. McLean: - "That the Minutes of the Meetings of December 20th. and 23rd. ultos. be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-

1. City Clerk, New Westminster, re. Burnaby-Westminster Joint Sewer, asking for an extension of time to September 30th. 1951.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Coldicutt: "That this be referred to the 1951 Council."

Carried unanimously.

2. Secretary, B.C. Anti-Tuberculosis Society re. Tuberular cattle; asking for endorsement of a resolution passed by the Board of Directors of this Society.

Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. McLean: "That the Resolution be endorsed, and forwarded to the Hon. the Provincial Secretary."

Carried unanimously.

3. Mr H. A. Lamb. Thanks for note of condolence.

Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. McLean: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

4. Dr Watson and the Chief Constable submitted Reports re. the Nursing home operated by Mr A. M. Roseberry, at 1529. 11th. Avenue.

Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That the Reports be received, and the recommendation of Dr Watson as to inspection by the Police department, be made effective".

Carried unanimously.

5. Mr A. M. Roseberry applied for license to operate a Nursing Home.

Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That the Chief Constable be asked to report whether the applicant is a fit and proper person to be licensed."

2. The Treasurer submitted a recommendation that the Contractors' deposit \$299.50 in respect of a residence for L. W. Hales, under the Better Housing Act, be refunded.
Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Coldicutt: "That the sum of \$299.50 be refunded to Messrs. Brewer and Lightfoot." Carried unanimously.
3. The Property Salesman submitted a Report on the transactions of the Property department for 1910.

4. The Medical Health Officer submitted a Report for the year 1910.

5. The Solicitors wrote re Greenhow Agreement - D.L. 43, enclosing a copy of a letter from Henry C. Macaulay & Co. advising that the Supplementary Agreement was not required by Mr Greenhow.
Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Rummel: "That the Solicitors be instructed that this Corporation is willing to drop the Supplementary Agreement, but will expect Mr Greenhow to pay the cost incurred in connection therewith." Carried unanimously.

5. That the matter of funds for providing work for unemployed men left to the Reeve, with the Treasurer and the Auditor, Mailed by Dr. Russell, Seconded by Dr. Brown; - "That the Report of the Board of Works, be adopted."
