

Monday - July 14th. 1922.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, July 14th. 1922, at 7-30 p.m.

Present: His worship Reeve Mr. Lean.

Councillors Young, Guinn, Rummel, Edgar, Lawson, and Russell.

Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - That the Minutes of the meeting of July 3rd. inst. be adopted as written, and confirmed.

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-

1. W.G.M. Grassie M.P. re. Postal addresses for mail delivery service, enclosing letter from the Deputy Postmaster General.  
Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - That the letters be received and filed, and that a suggestion be made to the Post Office department to change the name of Burnaby Lake post office to "Deer Lake" post office.

Carried unanimously.

2. Secretary, G.A.U.V. re. Domestic Lighting, expressing approval of the efforts to secure a reduced rate.  
Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - That the letter be received and filed.

Carried unanimously.

3. Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Russell: - That the Clerk ascertain from the Post Office department, the present status of mail delivery service to Capitol Hill district.

Carried unanimously.

4. Secretary, G.A.U.V. re. Shops Closing By-Law, - opposing the proposal.

Two petitions were also presented, signed by persons objecting to the proposed By Law.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Young: - That this lay on the Table pending further action on this matter.

Carried unanimously.

5. A largely signed Petition was presented, asking for mail delivery service in South Burnaby.

Moved by Mr. Young, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - That the Petition be endorsed.

Carried unanimously.

6. City of Winnipeg - extending invitation to attend the forthcoming convention of the Union of Canadian Municipalities.  
Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - That the letter be received and filed.

Carried unanimously.

1. Secretary Law Society of B.C. re. Letters from Messrs. Grant and Grant, advising that while the Benchers did not approve the letters in question, they did not consider it as misconduct calling for investigation.  
Moved by Mr. Edgar. Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That the letter be received and filed." Carried unanimously.
2. Public Works Engineer, acknowledging receipt of a certified copy of the Classification of Highways By Law, 1921.

4. Dominion Statistician re. Census 1921, advising that the population of Burnaby, as shown by the census, was 12,883.

5. H. C. Patterson re. Fire Prevention, suggesting a demonstration of his suggestion.  
Moved by Mr. Gairn. Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - "That this be referred to the Chief Constable and Mr. Edgar to arrange for a demonstration." Carried unanimously.
6. Deputy Provincial Secretary - forwarding copy of Order-in-Council authorizing the payment of the proportion of liquor profits to Vancouver General Hospital, the Royal Columbian Hospital, and Tranquille Sanatorium.  
Moved by Mr. Rummel. Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That the document be received and referred to the Treasurer." Carried unanimously.
7. H. Stanley, expressing appreciation of the efforts of the Police and Engineering departments during the recent bush fires.  
Moved by Mr. Young. Seconded by Mr. Edgar: - "That the letter be received and filed." Carried unanimously.
