

Monday - October 13th. 1922.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, October 13th. 1922, at 7.30 p.m.

Present: His Worship Reeve Mr. Lean.

Councillors Young, Gamm, Rummel, Edgar, Lawson, and Russell.

Moved by Mr. Lawson, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: "That the Minutes of the Meeting of October 9th. inst. be adopted as resitten and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:

1. See. M. C. Burnaby Ratepayers' Association re. Lowering Burnaby Lake, suggesting that the Great Northern Railway Co. be asked to contribute part of the cost.
Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Rummel: "That this be referred to the Joint Sewerage Board, and that the Reeve be asked to discuss the matter with that Board."

Carried unanimously.

2. Reid, Wallbridge & Co. re. Basil Podolanski, claiming \$190 for damages alleged to have been caused by surface water.
Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Young: "That this letter be tabled pro. tem."

Carried unanimously.

3. Post Office Department, advising that mail delivery service for the Burnaby Lake district has been authorised.
Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Russell: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

4. Secretary, Ward V Ratepayers' Association - endorsing the petition of local merchants that no further Oriental retail or Wholesale traders be licensed in this Municipality.
Moved by Mr. Lawson, Seconded by Mr. Gamm: "That no new licenses be granted to Oriental retail or wholesale traders in this Municipality."

Carried unanimously.

5. Secretary, Ward VI Ratepayers' Association - suggesting that more publicity be given to the Municipality.
Moved by Mr. Lawson, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: "That the Engineering department make a weekly return to the Municipal Clerk, of the Building Permits which have been issued."

Carried unanimously.

6. C. M. & N. Vancouver district, re. B. C. Electric Railway Co.

Passenger Rates Act. suggesting that a joint meeting of the representatives of the Municipalities concerned, be held in the near future.

The Reeve named Councillors Gairn and Russell as a Committee to arrange for a joint meeting.

Moved by Mr. Gairn. Seconded by Mr. Young:- "That this appointment be postponed.

Carried unanimously.

1. Secretary Attorney General, acknowledging receipt of suggestions re. B. C. Electric Railway Co. Passenger Rates Act. Moved by Mr. Russell. Seconded by Mr. Edgar:- "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

2. The Reeve submitted for the consideration of the Council the verbal request made to himself by the janitor of the High School, for a Retail Traders license. Moved by Mr. Russell. Seconded by Mr. Rummel:- "That the application of the janitor be not entertained."

Carried unanimously.

3. The Reeve submitted a recommendation that the Board of Works be financed to the extent of \$4000 in anticipation of the appropriation from the Pan-Pacific, to be divided as follows:-

(a) \$1500 between Wards 1, 5, and 6, in proportion to the assessment of these Wards.

(b) \$1500 between Wards 2, 3, and 4, in proportion to the assessment of these Wards.

Moved by Mr. Dawson. Seconded by Mr. Young:- "That this recommendation be adopted."

Carried unanimously.

4. The Deputy Provincial Secretary wrote, forwarding a copy of the Order-in-Council authorizing the appropriation of liquor profits to Hospitals.

Moved by Mr. Russell. Seconded by Mr. Rummel:- "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

Committee Reports:-

5. Finance Committee Report:- Your Committee met on October 16th. 1912, and recommend:-

1. That General Expenses, amounting to \$10494.64, be paid.
2. That Wages, amounting to \$1000.24, be paid.
3. That Land Sale Commissions, \$59.75, be paid.
4. That Mr. Chester Smith be reimbursed, \$4.50 in respect of the crossing to his property on Windsor Street.
5. That the House Purchasing system be extended to include

the Buena Vista district.

6. That the Requisitions be confirmed.
7. That the Great Northern Railway Co. account re. Crossing Signal at Douglas Road, be referred to Cr. Rummel and the Treasurer, with power to act.
8. That the Loggitham account re. Bonnette Bridge and Worth Road, be referred to Cr. Rummel with the Treasurer and the Engineers, with power to act.

Moved by Cr. Rummel, Seconded by Cr. Edgar: - That the Report of the Finance Committee be adopted.

Carried unanimously.

1. Water Committee Report:-

Your Committee met on October 16th. 1922, and recommend:-

1. That the Estimate of Work for the two weeks commencing October 16th. amounting to \$184.40, be adopted.
2. That the Supplementary Estimate, \$164.95, be adopted.
3. That the Estimate for construction, \$4482.59, be adopted, provided funds are available.
4. That the following extensions be laid, provided funds are available:-

W. 14. Almond Black 1. S. L. 96, at a cost of \$101.68.
C. V. Henson, Lot 5, Black 50. S. L. 159. in \$52.50.

Moved by Cr. Edgar, Seconded by Cr. Russell: - That the Report of the Water Committee be adopted.

Carried unanimously.

2. Board of Works Report:-

Your Committee met on October 16th. 1922, and recommend:-

1. That the Estimate of Work, amounting to \$619, together with a Supplementary Estimate, \$134, be adopted.
2. That formal application be made to the Board of Railway Commissioners re. Beyond Road ditch.
3. That the tender of Littleboy and Smith, \$150, be accepted for work in connection with the Culvert on Howard Ave.
4. That a grant of \$25 in labour, be made towards the cost of the proposed work to relieve surface water conditions south of Riverway.
5. That the Sub-division Plan of Block 8. S. L. 99, be tentatively approved.
6. That the Sub-division Plan of Block 5+1, S. L. 94, be finally approved.
7. That the Sub-division Plan of Blocks 1. S. L. 4 and 6, S. L. 125, be finally approved.
8. That no objection be entered to the proposed cancellation of

Sub-division Plan of Parcel "A" of Block 8 of Blocks 5 to 9
S. L. 96.

1. That the Septic Tank plans be revised to show a 3" cedar cover, a 6" concrete floor, and a 4' inlet; also that provision be made for provision of peace traps in certain cases.

4. That C. H. Cardell be granted an extension of time to November 15th.
5. That the offer of W. H. Brettle of \$5 for an old shack on Block 2. S. L. 11, be referred to Mr. Gairin and the Engineer to report.
6. That lots 1. 4. 4. 8. 9. 10 and 12, Block 4 or. S. L. 189, be reserved for general deposits.

Carried unanimously.

- A Report on the recent convention of the Union of B.C. Municipalities at Kamloops, was presented by the delegates.

Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Edgar: "That the Report be received, and that the delegates be thanked."

Carried unanimously.

- The Treasurer submitted offers to purchase Tax Sale Certificates as follows:—

- Mr. Edgar suggested that a committee wait on the Board of Underwriters to endeavour to secure better rates for Fire Insurance for those parts of this Municipality served by the Fire Departments of Vancouver, South Vancouver, and New Westminster. The Reeve named Mr. Edgar and the Clerk, as a committee.

- A Deputation attended with reference to the continuation of Bremerton Street from Macpherson Avenue to Royal Oak Avenue. The Reeve named Mr. Gavin and Russell as a Committee to

report on Monday next.

1. The Grand Army of United Veterans, Burnaby branch, applied for permission to sell "Poppies" on Armistice Day, November 11th. Moved by Mr. Russell, Seconded by Mr. Young: - "That permission be and is hereby granted."
