A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, February 5th. 1923, at 4.30 p.m.

Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That the Minutes of the Meetings of January 18th. and 22nd. ulto. be adopted as written and confirmed."

5. Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Lawson: - "That Tenders for Delightuses be invited for Monday, February 19th. inst., such Tenders to be opened at 7. 30pm on that date." Carried unanimously.
