

Monday. March 14th. 1914.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, March 14th. 1914, at 4-30 p.m.

Present:- His Worship Reeve McLean.

Councillors MacIville, Gavin, Rummel, Edgar, Campbell, Murray and Engleby.

Moved by Mr. Engleby, Seconded by Mr. MacIville:- "That the Minutes of the Meetings of March 3rd. and 10th. inst., be adopted as written, and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-

1. City Clerk, North Vancouver, re. Town Planning Act; forwarding copy of a resolution for the endorsement of this Council.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Edgar:- "That the letter be received, and that the visitor be informed that this Corporation, in Town Planning matters, is operating under the provisions of the amendment to Section 54 of the Municipal Act, which is well adapted to the requirements of this Municipality."

2. The District Superintendent of Postal Service wrote re. the application for a Post Office at Brent Street and Douglas Road, advising that this application is now the subject of enquiry.
