

Monday. October 24th. 1924.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, October 24th. 1924, at 4-30 p.m.

Present:- His worship Reeve McLean.

Councillors Neville, Gavin, Rummel, Edgar, Campbell, Murray, and Engberg.

Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Murray:- "That the Minutes of the Meeting of October 18th. inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Correspondence was received and dealt with, as follows:-
1 Secretary, South Ward 5 Ratepayers' Association, asking that this Council co-operate with Point Grey re. B.C. Telephone charges.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Engberg:- "That this matter be referred to the standing committee."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

2 Secretary, South Ward 5 Ratepayers' Association - re. Appropriation for Grant Street.

Moved by Mr. Edgar, Seconded by Mr. Rummel:- "That this be referred to the Board of Works."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

3 Post-master, New Westminster, re. Extension of mail delivery service.

Moved by Mr. Neville, Seconded by Mr. Campbell:- "That official application be made for the extension asked for by the petitioners."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

4 Manager, Vancouver Publicity Bureau, asking if records of weather conditions could be taken and kept by the Engineers' department.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Engberg:- "That this be referred to the Engineers to report at the next meeting of the Board of Works."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

5 The Clerk reported that the Medical Health Officer, Dr. G. de B. Watson, died on October 24th. inst.

Moved by Mr. Rummel, Seconded by Mr. Neville:- "That the Report be received."

6 Moved by Mr. Engberg, Seconded by Mr. Rummel:- "That the deepest sympathy and condolence of this Council be extended to Mr. G. de B. Watson and family."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

1. C. S. Armitage, asking for a reduction of assessment on account of the establishment of a veterinary hospital in his vicinity.
Moved by C. Murray, Seconded by C. Edgar: "That the matter of assessment be referred to the Assessor, and the complaint be referred to the Police department.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

2. Y. H. G. Rose re. Lots 18 to 30 inclusive, Blk. 4. D. L. 54, stating his inability to complete payment of the purchase price, and asking to be permitted to retain Lot 18 & 19, and 29 & 30 at a purchase price of \$568.45 against which would be applied \$259.00 being the proportion of the total amount already paid, he to quit claim the remaining lots, and to pay the taxes accrued on lots 18, 19, 29 & 30.

Moved by C. Edgar, Seconded by C. Rummel: "That this matter be referred to the Reeve, with C. Gairn and the Treasurers, with power to act."

 6. That a grant of \$25.00 be made to the Benevolent Fund of the New Westminster Fire Department.
 7. That a grant of \$25.00 be made to the Benevolent Fund of the South Vancouver Fire Department, and that the Corporation of South Vancouver be reimbursed for the loss of two lengths of hose.
 8. That the tenders for printing Property Price Lists be referred to a special committee to accept the lowest tender.
 9. That the Requisitions be confirmed.
 10. That permission be granted to the G. C. N. V. to sell poppies on November 8th. and 10th. prox.

Your committee met on October 20th. 1934, and recommends:-

3. That the Estimate for construction of (1) Larissa Road "main" \$1154.00, and (2) 18 inch valve at Spence Street, \$550.00, be adopted, subject to funds for the purpose being available.
4. That an extension be laid to Lot 3, Block 21, S. L. 94, at a cost of \$68.54, provided funds are available.
5. That the recommendation of the Special Committee re. water rates be referred to the 1925 Council.

Moved by W. Edgar, Seconded by W. Langberg: - "That the Report of the Water Committee be adopted."

3. 3. That the Supplementary Estimate, \$840.14, be approved.
4. 4. That application be made to the B.C.B.Ry. Co. for a crossing at Antoin Avenue.
5. 5. That an expenditure of \$2500.00 be authorised for work on Mayne Avenue.
3. 6. That the Sub-division Plan of Lots 45 and 46, Block 2, S. L. 95, be finally approved.
4. 7. That \$1000.00 be now spent on Boundary Road, and \$500.00 be held for necessary maintenance for the balance of the current year.
4. 8. That the recommendation of the Engineer re. ditch through Block 29, S. L. 98, be adopted.
9. 9. That the proposal of the Northern Transfer Co. re. supply of gravel from Stride Avenue put for Spring Avenue, be referred to the Revenues and the Engineer, with power to act.

Cassed unanimously.

Moved by W. Edgar, Seconded by W. Murray: - "That the report be amended by striking out the words 'in its present form', and be adopted as so amended."

Cassed unanimously.

Moved by W. Rummel, Seconded by W. Campbell: - "That a copy of the Report be forwarded to the Central Ratepayers' Association."
