

Monday - April 8th. 1929.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, April 8th. 1929 at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

Present: His Worship Reeve Burdick in the chair.

Councillors West, Rylett, Lambert, Pritchard, Wheatley, Shawbrooks and Wilson:

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Rylett: "That the minutes of the meetings of March 18th and 25th ultimos be adopted as written and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Automobile Club of B.C. advising that the Club had been instrumental in having an amendment to the Motor Vehicle Act brought down providing for placing of signs on the highways warning autoists that they are travelling within a school zone and to exercise due precaution, and suggesting that the signs erected pursuant to this amendment be worded "School Zone".

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Rylett: "That the letter be received and the suggestion be adopted."

Carried unanimously.

Miss W.N. Wilson - complaining of "pighouses" etc on road allowances in D.L.119 and also as to condition of Rosser Avenue.

Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: "That this matter be referred to the Councillor for the Ward and the Engineer."

Carried unanimously.

J. McDonald was suggesting that steps be taken to eliminate the dog nuisance.

Moved by Cr. Rylett, Seconded by Cr. Pritchard: "That this matter be referred to the Chief constable."

Carried unanimously.

Messrs McQuarrie, Whiteside and Duncan - suggesting that the resolution of the Council passed on February 4th. ultimo providing for payment in to Court of monies due M. Cosco, be rescinded, that a resolution authorizing the Treasurer to pay over the moneys to them for distribution in accordance with the Treasurer's statement to be forwarded to them with the cheque.

The Engineer submitted report and estimate on petition for construction of a 6' cement concrete sidewalk on the northside of Hastings St. from Ellesmere to Holdom amounting to \$629.55 - Annual estimated rate to owners .2385

Moved by Cr. Pritchard, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the report and estimate be received and filed and the Clerk be instructed to bring down necessary by-law."

Carried unanimously.

The Treasurer submitted report on Proposed Fire By-law:

Moved by Cr. Pritchard, Seconded by Cr. Rylett: "That the report be tabled pending report from the Treasurer as to amounts required for maintenance of Fire Areas Nos. 1, and 2 for the year 1929."

Carried unanimously.

His Worship the Reeve submitted a recommendation that the sum of \$5000.00 added to Board of Works (Roads and Bridges Appropriation and divided equally among the wards)

set up in the Estimates be re-allotted to Trunk Roads for improvement of Sperling Avenue only.

Moved by Cr. Pritchard, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That the recommendation of His Worship the Reeve be adopted."

An amendment was Moved by Cr. Rylett, Seconded by Cr. ShewBrooks: "That the item of \$7,000.00 set up in the Estimates for Town Planning be deleted and that this amount be added to the \$5,000.00 referred to in the recommendation of His Worship the Reeve and that the whole amount be used for improvement of Sperling Avenue."

An amendment to the amendment was Moved by Cr. Wilson, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the Engineer be requested to submit an estimate of amount necessary to complete the preliminary costs in connection with re-contouring proposals, Capitol Hill, and that this recommendation be tabled pending receipt of this estimate."

Carried unanimously.

His Worship the Reeve submitted a report recommending that this Council go on record as favouring the construction of Willingdon Avenue from Marine Drive to Burrard Inlet as a North and South Highway and that the Engineer be requested to submit detailed estimates of cost by September 30th next, for submission of a by-law to the electors.

Moved by Cr. Pritchard, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: "That this recommendation be tabled for consideration in Board of Works."

Carried - Cr. Wheatley against.

The Treasurer submitted Estimates in connection with Fire Areas Nos. 1 and 2 as follows:

- No. 1. Total \$3,500.00 necessitating mill rate of 1.15 mills
- No. 2. Total \$3,535.50 less \$1,035.50 now in hand from 1928 - necessitating mill rate of .25 mills.

The Treasurer also submitted recommendation that the proposed Fire By-law ~~making~~ be amended to make provision for the coming into effect of same at January 1st, 1930, otherwise two fire rates would be necessary.

(a) To provide for the housing, maintenance and operation of the fire apparatus provided for the said Fire Area, one and fifteen one-hundredths (1.15) mills in the dollar to be called the "Burnaby Fire Area No.1. Maintenance Rate."

(4) There shall be raised, levied and collected for the year 1929 upon the assessed value of the land and upon fifty per centum of the improvements in the Burnaby Fire Area No.2. as shown by the last revised assessment roll thereof a tax of twenty five one hundredths (.25) mills in the dollar for the following purpose:

(a) To provide for the housing, maintenance and operation of the fire apparatus provided for the said Fire Area, twenty five one hundredths (.25) mills in the dollar to be called the "Burnaby Fire Area No.2. Maintenance Rate."

Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr.Pritchard, Seconded by Cr.Lambert: "That the Department of Public Works, District Engineer's, attention be drawn to the complaint of J.I.Stinson re sidewalk on Hastings Barnet Road near the school, and that he be advised that this sidewalk was removed by Department employees in cleaning out a ditch and was not replaced, and that the District Engineer be requested to have same replaced as soon as possible."
