

Wednesday - March 15th, 1933.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, March 16th, 1933 at 10.00 a.m.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of March 8th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

1. W.G. McQuarrie & Co - advising that the Chief Engineer - Department of Public Works regrets the delay in forwarding cheque in settlement of claim of this Corporation for compensation for land taken in building the Central Arterial Highway but that the matter was being expedited as quickly as possible.  
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."
2. Sec. B.C. Government Relief Land Settlement Committee - expressing regret that funds did not permit of any residents of this Municipality taking up land under the Relief Land Settlement plan.  
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."
3. Chief Clerk, Forestry Branch - requesting payment of Royalty account for cordwood removed from Central Park amounting to \$29.23 on or before March 31st, 1933.  
Ordered: "That the letter be received and be referred to the Treasurer for attention."
4. Mrs. Aymee J. Scott and others - calling attention to condition of the sidewalk constructed as a Local Improvement on Curragh Avenue from Kingsway to B.C.E.R. The Acting Engineer submitted estimate of cost of carrying out repairs as \$34.10  
Ordered: "That the Estimate of the Engineer be approved and that the work be put in hand forthwith and that the petitioners be so advised."
5. E.L. Tyner - protesting against the use of Richmond Park as a playground owing to present position of back-stop.  
The Engineer submitted recommendation that the stop be removed to a new location at the northwest corner of the Park and that additional fencing be installed along the Richmond St. frontage all at an estimated cost of \$14.50 exclusive of material.  
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be approved."
6. Messrs N.J. Stanton and J.W. Greenwood - applying to cut wood for commercial purposes of Corporation tax sale land in ravine in Blocks 65, 66, 70, 71 72 and 73 D.L. 218.  
Ordered: "That a permit be granted these applicants to cut wood for their own use only."
7. W.G. Murrin - President, B.C.E.R. advising that His Company would consider granting the Corporation the use of a portion of their right of way on the Central Park line from Dow Avenue to Widdington Avenue provided the said pathway was fenced and otherwise adequately protected.  
The Acting Engineer submitted an estimate of cost of fencing and construction of footpath as \$5,150.00  
Ordered: "That the letter and estimate be received and filed and copies of same be forwarded to the Town Planning Commission with information that lack of funds at this time will render it impossible to have this work carried out."
8. G. Conway Brown - requesting permission to use Lot 4, Block 21, D.L. 187 for garden purposes.  
Ordered: "That the use of this lot be granted for the balance of the year at a nominal rental of \$1.00"
9. W.E. Hazard - applying to lease pe Lot 3, Block 6, D.L. 57/58  
Ordered: "That a lease be granted for a term of five years at a yearly rental of \$1.00 plus taxes and \$50.00 worth of improvements per year."
10. H. Gardner - applying to use Lot D Block 45, D.L. 151-3 for garden purposes.  
Ordered: "That the use of this lot be granted for balance of the year at a nominal rental of \$1.00."
11. Sec. V & D J S & D Board submitted copy of minutes of meeting of the Board March 6th showing copy of resolution authorizing the Chairman to negotiate on behalf of the Board a two year loan with the Federal Government at the lowest possible interest rate for the purpose of completing the South Hill Trunk sewer. The motion was carried Commission-

er Bennett dissenting.

Ordered: "That the minutes be received and be spread upon the minutes of this meeting"

The Treasurer submitted recommendations that rebates under section 274 of the Municipal act be made as follows:

R.Allen - Lot 1, SD "F-G-H" Blk.7. D.L.125. \$5.86 1932 penalty.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Treasurer be adopted."

2. The Deputy Engineer submitted recommendation that gravel at cost of \$90.00 be supplied on Spratt Street to improve the street

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Deputy Engineer be approved."

Ordered: "That the Board of Works estimate of work as submitted March 8th, 1933 amounting to \$545.00 be adopted, and that the supplementary estimate \$50.00 be approved."

Ordered: "That compensation for loss of poultry destroyed by stray dogs in 1932 be allowed as follows:

3 AND that each claimant be authorised to submit claim in the foregoing amounts respectively provided that in all cases where taxes or water rates are owing to the Corporation by the said claimant, the amount of said taxes or water rates be deducted from the amount of the said claim."

Ordered: "That the Commissioner do now sit as a Committee of the Whole to reconsider Burnaby Unemployment Loan By-law No.3,1933."

Ordered: "That the committee do now arise and report the by-law complete without amendment."

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Unemployment Loan By-law No.3,1933 be now read a third time."

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Unemployment Loan By-law No.3,1933 do pass the Third reading, that it be signed by the Commissioner and the Clerk and that the corporate seal be affixed thereto."

Ordered: "That Burnaby Acquisition of Property By-law No.1,1933 be introduced and read a first time."

Ordered: "That Burnaby Acquisition of Property By-law No.1,1933 do pass the first reading."

Ordered: "That Burnaby Acquisition of Property By-law No.1,1933 be now read a second time."

Ordered: "That Burnaby Acquisition of Property By-law No.1,1933 do pass the second reading."

The sitting then adjourned.
