

- Wednesday - September 20th, 1933.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, September 20th, 1933 at 10.00 a.m.  
Present: Commissioner John Bennett and the Municipal Clerk.

Ordered: "That the Minutes of the sitting of September 13th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Trades and Labor Council - forwarding resolution adopted by the City Council of Windsor, Ontario, as follows:

"That the Municipal Council of the City of Windsor do and it does hereby resolve to restrict its purchases to such industrial, manufacturing and merchandising firms as maintain a fair wage standard and give employment employees work for a sufficient number of hours per week to ensure a decent living."

Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and the resolution be endorsed."

1. W.C. McQuarrie, K.C. - advising that owing to his appointment as a Judge of the Court of Appeal for British Columbia he was compelled to discontinue acting as Municipal solicitor.

Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and the resignation be accepted, and that the congratulations of this Corporation be suitably conveyed to Mr. McQuarrie."

Secretary, Central Park Local Committee - advising that the Local Committee were in favour of permitting needy property owners and tenants of Burnaby to cut down timber, etc. from Central Park for fuel purposes and suggested that the Local Committee be authorized to issue permits.

2. Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and that the issuing of permits for cutting wood in Central Park be authorized, all permits to be issued by the Engineering Department subject to the following regulations:

1. No Commercial permits to be granted.
2. Permits to be for a maximum of two cords only to be cut within time limit of 30 days.
3. One month at least to elapse before a second permit is granted.
4. Two permits not to be granted to the same family if living in same house.
5. No permit valid until countersigned by the Park caretaker.
6. All cutting to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Local Park committee and the Caretaker.
7. Only relief cases and unemployed are expected to take advantage of these permits.

The Property Salesman submitted a report on application to purchase 3 acre portion of Block 1, D.L. 70. E. 50 ac of West half, and recommended that said parcel be sold on the usual basis plus the cost of necessary survey.  
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Property salesman be and is hereby approved."

3. The Property Salesman submitted report on application to purchase old shed presently situate on Lot 14, Block 21, D.L. 53, for the sum of \$5.00 and recommended that the offer be accepted.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Property salesman be and is hereby approved."

Ltd. on behalf of the Dominion Bridge Co. for an 8" valved connection from the Greater Vancouver Districts 36" main on Boundary Road, to be used for fire protection only. The total cost of the work to be borne by them, and recommended that the application be granted, and that application be made to the Water District for the necessary connections.

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Property Exchange By-law No. 3, 1933 do pass the third reading, that it be signed by the Commissioner and the Clerk and that the Corporate seal be affixed thereto."
