

Wednesday - June 21st, 1933.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, June 21st, 1933 at 10.00 a.m.  
Present: Commissioner Bennett and the Municipal Clerk.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of June 14th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Deputy Provincial Secretary - forwarding certified copy of Order in Council No.800 giving power to the Commissioner to make and allow certain rebates of taxes levied in 1932 on improvements incorrectly placed upon the 1932 assessment roll.  
Ordered: "That the letter and Order in Council be received and filed."

2. David McLeod - requesting permission to remove a building presently situate on Lot 2, Block 59, D.L. 188 to Lot 1, Block 59, D.L.188 temporarily.  
Ordered: "That permission be granted to Mr. McLeod to use Lot 1, Block 59, D.L.188 for purpose of storing building presently situate on Lot 2, up to and including September 30th, 1933."

3. Town Planning Commission - recommending that the provisions of the Burnaby Town Planning By-law be waived to permit of the erection of a building 16' by 20' on Block "B" D.L.90.N. for use as a Bakery for a period of three years, on condition that the applicant gives an undertaking not to make any addition or extension without first obtaining the approval of the Town Planning Commission.  
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Town Planning Commission be and is hereby adopted."

4. S.M.Ashwell - making application for permission to use Southhalf of Lot 4, Block 47, D.L.95, for garden purposes.  
Ordered: "That use of South half of Lot 4, Block 47, D.L. 95 be granted to S.M. Ashwell for the balance of the year. at a nominal rental of \$1.00."

5. The Acting Deputy Municipal Engineer submitted report on application of Mr.Hakala and others for improvements to Thorne Road at the B.C.E.R. crossing and advised that the cost of repairing the crossing for vehicular traffic was approximately \$50.00. As only two residences would be benefitted and the present crossing was available for pedestrians the Engineer could not recommend that this expenditure be incurred, but on the other hand recommended that new "Road closed" signs be erected as a safeguard.  
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be and is hereby adopted."

The Relief officer submitted report for period June 1st to 15th showing a total number of cases as 2052 with an expenditure of \$17,428.19.. The Relief officer pointed out that this report showed a reduction of 165 cases over the previous report.  
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

The Treasurer submitted a recommendation that tax rebates under the provisions of Order in Council No. 800 be made as follows:
