

Wednesday - May 31st, 1933.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, May 31st, 1933 at 10.00 a.m.

Present: Commissioner Bennett and the Municipal Clerk.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the meeting of May 25th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

1. Burnaby Town Planning Commission - recommending that the provisions of the Town Planning By-law be waived to permit of the erection and operation by G.P. Hovey of a retail store on property situate at the south west corner of Royal Oak Avenue and Rumble Street.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed for reference when application is received."

2. Burnaby Town Planning Commission - advising that the Commission was opposed to the operation of any auto tourist camps in any of the Parks in Burnaby
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

3. C.L. Colby - claiming compensation for loss of 75 head of poultry at \$1.00 each alleged to have been destroyed by dog or dogs unknown to the owner of the poultry. Constable Jeffery submitted report advising that he had seen the bodies of 47 Plymouth Rock and Rhode Island Red birds.
Ordered: "That the letter and report be received and be tabled for consideration with similar applications towards the end of the year."

4. C.K. Blakenay - offering to purchase approximately 4 ton of old wire and insulators formerly part of the Police telephone system for the sum of \$20.00
The Clerk advised that an advertisement had been placed in the local press calling for offers for this material but that no replies had been received.
Ordered: "That the offer of Mr. Blakenay be received and accepted."

5. K. Paulsen - advising that he accepts the arrangement made for correcting the error in the local improvement charges on Lot 19, Blocks 14, 18, 19 and 20. D.L. 35. as embodied in report of special committee dated November 26th, 1932.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

Ordered: "That notice be served on the owners of Lot 19, Blocks 14, 18, 19 and 20 D.L. 35, that the Commissioner will sit at 10.00 o'clock a.m. on the 14th day of June, A.D. 1933 to take steps pursuant to subsection 4 of section 47 of the Local Improvement Act to correct the error made in Local Improvement Debenture By-law No. 23, 1928."

6. A. McRae - applying for permission to pile cordwood on Lot 15 E $\frac{1}{2}$ S.D. 13, Blocks 13-16. D.L. 158.E.
Ordered: "That temporary permission be granted subject to the right of cancellation on two weeks notice being given in writing, and further subject to the lot being kept in a neat and tidy condition at all times."

The Deputy Municipal Engineer submitted recommendation that B.C.E.R. pole plans be approved as follows:

7. K.8800/1662 Proposed pole line on Boundary Road, north of Edinburgh Street.
Distance from property line to outside face of poles to be 10'6"
K.8800/1665 Proposed pole line on Sea Avenue, south of Dundas Street. Distance from property line to outside face of poles to be 10'6".

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Deputy Engineer be adopted."

The Deputy Engineer submitted estimates of work as follows:

Ordered: "That the estimates as submitted be approved subject to funds being available."

The Central Park Local Committee wrote requesting a supply of gravel to improve certain trails in Central Park alleged to have been damaged by the hauling of wood
The Deputy Engineer submitted estimate of cost as \$36.00 and advised that he could not recommend that this sum be expended for this purpose.
Ordered: "That the report of the Engineer be tabled pending inspection on the ground."

8. The Deputy Engineer and Treasurer submitted report on claim of R.E. Cave for payment for services as Caretaker - Lochdale park and recommended that the claimant be paid \$25.00 in full for his services up to June 8th, 1933 and that his services be dispensed with as at that date.
Ordered: "That the recommendation be adopted."

The Treasurer submitted recommendation that tax sale certificates be sold as follows:

1 Lots 7 and 9, Block 19, D.L. 27. to Francis N. Turner \$151.83

2 Lot 1, SD 6/8, Blk. "D" D.L. 96 to M.A. Beard - \$180.44

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Treasurer be adopted."

3 Ordered: "That lease of Lot "B" Block 5, D.L. 125 to Frank Haney be signed by the Commissioner and the Clerk and that the Corporate seal be affixed thereto."

The requisitions were then examined.

Ordered: "That the requisitions as submitted be approved."

The sitting then adjourned.
