

Wednesday - August 1st.1934

A regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, August 1st.1934 at 10.00 a.m.
Present: Commissioner Fraser - Mr.F.Bolton, Dr. Sager, A.C.Fell, Building Inspector and B.P.Scott and the Municipal Clerk.

Ordered: "That the minutes of sitting of July 26th ultimo be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

City Clerk, Kamloops - forwarding copy of resolution to be submitted to the Union of B.C.Municipalities regarding appointment and payment of Police Magistrates - and requesting endorsement.
Ordered: "That the letter and resolution be received and filed."

Dr.W.G.Hallard -- applying for permit to build an addition to his abattoir on Byrne Road. The Building Inspector requested instructions.
The Medical Health Officer advised that the erection contemplated was being made with a view to tidying up the premises.

Ordered: "That a permit be granted subject to all provisions of the Building By-law and Provincial Sanitary regulations being observed and on the further understanding that the granting of this permit is not to be construed as in any way varying the orders of the Local Board of Health relative to the operation of the abattoir."

Messrs Savage & Keith - claiming compensation on behalf of J.S.Cowper re alleged nuisance from Capitol Hill pump.

The Works Superintendent reported everything had been done to keep the pump as quiet as possible and that the only remedy is in replacing the present pump with a pump of a different nature.

Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and Messrs Savage and Keith be advised that this Corporation can admit no grounds for liability."

Mrs Christie and others submitted petition praying that the permit granted to erect an addition to Hall on Lot 18, Block 12, D.L.186 be cancelled.

The Building Inspector submitted report advising that the permit was in order and that the addition was being erected in conformity with Municipal by-laws.

Ordered: "That the petition be received and filed and the complainants be advised that no action can be taken."

Ordered: "That the recommendations of the Treasurer be and are hereby adopted."

Pemberton & Son Vancouver Limited wrote offering to purchase \$2,000. Dominion of Canada Gtd C.N.R. equipment 5% bonds, due February 1,1935 at par and one-quarter. The Treasurer recommended that the offer be accepted.

Ordered: "That the sale of \$2,000. Dominion of Canada Gtd C.N.R. equipment 5% bonds, due February 1. 1936 to Pemberton & Son Vancouver Limited, at price of par and one-quarter be approved, and that the Commissioner and Clerk be and are hereby authorised to sign the Indenture of Transfer and to affix the Corporate seal thereto.

Pemberton & Son Vancouver Limited wrote offering to sell to the Corporation \$2,000. Burnaby 5% bonds due December 31 1936 at 63 flat. The Treasurer recommended that the purchase be made.

Ordered: "That therecommendation of the Treasurer be and is hereby approved."

Ordered: "That General accounts \$71,000.15 Relief accounts \$21,332.21; Pay Rolls \$2,372.79 and Salaries 5,366.37 be approved for payment.

The Property Salesman and Assessor submitted recommendation that W¹/₂ Lot 13, Block 32, D.L.13. be sold to H.T.Borjesson and that conveyance of Lot 7, Blocks 50 & 51, D.L.95, plus \$10.00 costs, be accepted in full payment therefor subject to taxes on latter parcel being paid to the end of 1934.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Assessor and Property salesman be and is hereby approved.

The Medical Health Officer submitted verbal report re general health conditions advising there had been a drop in the incidence of Scarlet fever.

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Tax Sale Redemption Extension By-law 1934 be introduced and read a first time.
