Ordered: "That Mr.E. L. R.mmer be and is hereby appointed Relief Officer for the Corporation of Burnaby to take effect as at November 1st.1934.".

Delegates from the Burnuby Workers organizations then addressed the Commissioner demanding (1) that no work be instituted until the demands presented by delegation, namely that all work be paid for at 50 cents per hour and that each worker be allowed to earn \$15.00 per month in excess of contract work be immediately abolished. and (4) that all persons over the age of 16 years be granted full adult allowance both for food and shelter.

The Commissioneradvised the delegation that Relief would continue to be administered in accordance with instructions from the Provincial Government and that he would not recognize any complaint committee but that individual cases would receive consideration if submitted personally.

The sitting then adjourned.
