

Wednesday - September 26th, 1934.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, September 26th, 1934 at 10.00 a.m.
Present: Commissioner Fraser; Mr. R. Bolton, Mr. L. Mimmer; Mr. B. P. Scott and the Clerk.
Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of September 19th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

C.M.C. West Vancouver - forwarding copies of resolutions submitted by the West Vancouver Council to the Union of B.C. Municipalities Convention.
Ordered: "That the letter and resolutions be received and filed."

Mrs. C. C. Knight - expressing appreciation for receiving extension of time under Section 274.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

S. S. Penny - Franchise officer - requesting permission and approval of his posting election notices on poles and fences throughout the Municipality.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and approval be granted."

The Treasurer submitted report advising at 97 "soldiers" took advantage of extension of one year for the payment of their delinquent taxes, out of which some 37 waived the extension and performed work to the same extent under the Burnaby Delinquent Taxes By-law 1934, the amount involved being \$2,115.78
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

Ordered: "That General accounts to Sept. 19th. \$40,605.79 (including \$27,270.60 Social service charges offset against Motor License grant); Relief accounts \$1,542.12 and Pay rolls \$2,558.32 be approved for payment."
