

Wednesday, December 11th, 1935.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, December 11th, 1935 at 10.00 a.m.

Present: Commissioner H. M. Fraser, Messrs: F. J. Rundle, W. P. Philips, Wm. Sager, M. A. C. Bell, J. G. Neill, E. L. Rimmer, C. E. Brown, and R. Bolton.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of December 4th. be adopted as written and confirmed."

R. Dunn, Officer in Charge, Burnaby District, B. C. Provincial Police submitted report for the month of November, 1935.

Ordered: "That the report be received."

Medical Health Officer submitted report for the month of November, 1935.

Ordered: "That the report be received."

The Treasurer submitted statement of receipts and payments for month of November showing Receipts as \$73,127.17, Payments as \$99,808.65. The Treasurer also submitted Waterworks return for the month of November.

Ordered: "That the statement be received and filed, and that the Waterworks return be adopted."

The Property salesman submitted report on sales for the month of November, advising that fourteen sales were made amounting to \$4,305.00.

Ordered: "That the report of the Property Salesman be received and filed."

The Engineer submitted monthly report, for November, on works carried out by the Board of Works Department.

Ordered: "That the report of the Engineer be adopted."

The Engineer submitted report showing activities of the Waterworks Department for month of November, 1935.

Ordered: "That the report be received and filed and that a further report be submitted respecting the last item in the report."

The Building Inspector submitted report for month of November, 1935.

Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

The Relief Officer submitted report for month of November, showing total number of Unemployment relief cases as 1700 with total expenditure of \$39,064.14

Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

Property Committee report:

Your Committee met on Wednesday, December 11th, 1935 and recommends:

1. That Lot 3, Block 3, D.L. 158 be sold to Mrs. E.O. Green and that conveyance of Lot 1, Block 3, D.L. 158 be accepted in full payment therefor, plus costs.

Your Committee met on Thursday, November 28th, 1935 and recommend:

1. That Lots 1 and 2, Block 2, D.L. 68 be sold to T.S. Annandale, for the sum of \$392.28
2. That Lot 41, Block 93, D.L. 122, be sold to H. Cullerne for sum of \$366.24

Ordered: "That the report of the Property Committee be and is hereby adopted."

The Clerk submitted petition received praying for enactment of an early closing By-law covering Meat dealers, and advised that the petition was not signed by a sufficient number of holders of trades licenses to bring same within the provisions of the Shops Regulation Act.

Ordered: "That the report be received and filed and that the petitioners be advised the this Corporation cannot see its way to passing a closing By-law of its own initiative."

The Engineer submitted a report on application of the B.C.E.R. for approval of a pole location on Willingdon Avenue between Kootenay and Cypress Streets, and advised that as the full right of way for this highway has not been acquired it is not possible to give the Company a permanent pole location, but that he recommended that a permanent location be granted for two of the poles subject to the Company agreeing to accept the location for the third pole as a temporary one only subject to removal if and when the Corporation acquires the additional right of way.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted."

The Engineer submitted a recommendation that B.C.E.R. pole plan No. K. 8800/1894 covering proposed pole line in lane north of Albert Street, west of Willingdon Avenue, Distance of poles to be 1'0" from centre of pole to property line and in line with existing poles, be approved.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be and is hereby adopted."

The Building Inspector submitted report advising that Ornamental Street Lighting Standard No. 46, has been damaged to the extent of about \$50.00 but that no report has as yet been received from the Police department.

Ordered: "That the report of the Building Inspector be received and filed."

The Local Assistant Fire Marshal submitted report showing number and extent of fires occurring in the Municipality during the month of November - Loss \$355.00

Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

The Treasurer submitted a recommendation that tax sale certificate covering Lot 14, Block 3, D.L. 91, S.E. be sold to Alfred W. McLeod Limited, New Westminster, for the sum of \$91.10
