

Thursday - September 12th, 1935.

A regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Thursday, September 12th, 1935 at 10.00 a.m.

Present: Commissioner Hugh M Fraser; Messrs F.J. Russell; W.P. Philips; B.P. Scott; A.C. Bell; E.L. Rimmer; R. Bolton and C.B. Brown.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sittings of September 4th and 9th instants be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

- A. Frazer - complaining of the nuisance from dogs in the Stillbridge area.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and that Mr. Frazer be advised of the steps being taken by the Corporation to control the dog nuisance."
- Mrs. John Shaw - complaining of lack of water supply - Cameron Road.
The Superintendent advised that this service was supplied by means of a temporary 1" line and that improvement could be given by giving them an extra connection.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and that the suggestion of the Superintendent be adopted."
- Messrs Crehan, Mouat & Co - Auditors - advising that they had carried out an examination of the accounts and records of the Municipality for the six months ended June 30th, 1935 and found them to be in order.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."
- Major Shaw - Salvation Army - requesting grant in aid of the work of the Army.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and that Major Shaw be advised that the financial position of the Municipality renders it impossible for any grants to be made at this time."
- Wm. Dee - complaining of the necessity for cleaning out ditches on Douglas Road near Still Creek.
The Superintendent advised that this work was provided for in a Working out taxes contract.
Ordered: "That the letter be received and that Mr. Dee be so advised."
- Cpl. Dunn - N.C.O. i/c Burnaby Detachment Provincial Police submitted report of the work of the Police department for month of August.
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Treasurer submitted statement of receipts and expenditures for month of August as follows: Receipts \$89,648.34 Expenditures \$105,037.36
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Treasurer submitted Waterworks Return for month of August showing number of live services at end of month as 7341 with collections \$3,516.43
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Medical Health Officer submitted report for month of August.
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Building Inspector submitted report on application of Vancouver Heights Baptist Church for waiver of Building By-law to permit erection of a fuel shed at a lesser distance from the property line than provided for in the By-law, and recommended that as the adjacent owner had no objection that the provisions of the By-law be waived to permit of this erection.
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Building Inspector be adopted."
- The Board of Works Superintendent submitted report showing activities of the Board of Works Department for month of August.
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Commissioner submitted verbal report as to convention of Union of B.C. Municipalities, advising that the Superannuation committee of the Union had been given further time and power to present their report to the Legislature.
- The Superintendent submitted report showing activities of the Water Department for month of August - showing total consumption of water as 109,062,430 gallons.
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Superintendent submitted a recommendation that B.C.E.F. pole plan K.8800/1857 covering proposed pole location on Winch Street east of Holdom Avenue be approved, poles to be set 10'6" from outside face of pole to property line.
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Superintendent be adopted."
- The Local Assistance Fire Marshal submitted report showing 5 fires in the Municipality during month of August with a loss of \$1600.00
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."
- The Property salesman submitted report for month of August showing 2 sales with purchase price of \$150.00
Ordered: "That the report be received and filed."

The Relief Officer submitted report for month of August showing total number of persons in receipt of relief as 4978 with total expenditure of \$37,445.70
