A delegation representing the Burnaby Workers Association under the chairmanship of Mr.D.Currie attended, accompanied by some 120 other persons, and addressed the Commissioner .rging upon him the necessity of supplimenting the present relief with an additional allowance for the Xmas season. The Commissioner advised the delegation that it was not within his power to grant their request, and that he had taken the matter up with the Provincial Government who had also advised that they could not grant the request. The spokesman for the delegation then requested the Commissioner to either provide transportation for a delegation to attend the Government at Victoria, or in the alternative to arrange for an interview between the Minister of Labour and themselves in Vancouver.

The Commissioner advised the delegation that he was unable to grant their request for transportation to Victoria, but that he would try and arrange a hearing for the delegation in Vancouver.

The assembly then withdrew.
