

Wednesday - November 20th, 1935

The Commissioner sat as a Council on Wednesday, November 20th, 1935 at 10.00 a.m. at the Municipal Hall.  
Present: Commissioner Fraser; R. Bolton, F.J. Russell; A.C. Bell; W.P. Philps; Dr. Wm. Sager; E.L. Rimmer and C.B. Brown.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of November 13th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Secretary, Board of Management - V.O.N. expressing appreciation of the Board for the action of the Commissioner in replacing their scales and also for the interest shown in the work of the Order.

Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

L & C Haymoulder - expressing appreciation for the work of the Board of Works in providing guard rail at Gilmore Avenue, between G.N.R. and B.C.E.R.

Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

Ordered: "That the Requisitions as submitted to November 20th, 1935 be and are hereby approved."

Ordered: "That the Commissioner do now sit as a committee of the whole to reconsider the District of Burnaby automobile garages, automobile service or repair shops and gasoline service stations early closing By-law 1935."

The Clerk reported that it had been intimated to him that certain garagemen who had signed the petition praying for the enactment of an Early closing By-law had done so under a misapprehension and were submitting their protest in writing. Representatives of the Luxor Service Station; Charles F. Storey - Mr. Campbell and C.J. Hamilton addressed the Commissioner advising that they had signed the petition but were not fully posted as to the contents of the said petition. Mr. H.C. Plymmer addressed the commissioner and stated that he had not been given an opportunity of either signing or refusing to sign the petition.  
Ordered: "That the Committee do now rise and report progress."

Ordered: "That the "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.7.1935." be introduced and read a first time."

Ordered: "That the "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 7. 1935 do pass the first reading."

Ordered: "That the "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.7.1935" be now read a second time."

Ordered: "That the "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.7.1935" do pass the second reading."

The sitting then adjourned.
