P.J.Pussell - School Board - advising that the Board had entered into a contract with J.Reyklin for servicing all typewriters at a flat rate of 25 cents per machine per month - ribbons 75 cts extra. The Treasurer recommended that the existing contract between the Corporation and the United Typewriter Coy, be terminated and that a new contract be entered into with Vr.Reyklin respecting the Corporation's machines, on the same basis as the School machines.

Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Pressurer be adopted."

The Clerk submitted applications received for use of Municipal Parks and recommended that Wednesday, September 25th be the last date on which applications for use of playgrounds for the football season of 1935\$36 will be received. Ordered: That the recommendation of the Clerk be adopted and that application be made to the Clers for tabulation and allottment.

The Treasurer reported that in accordance with the Municipal Act he had duly convened the 1935 Tax sale and on instructions from the Commissioner had adjourned the sale until 10 a.m. 17th inst. and that together with the Commissioner and Municipal Solicitor had interviewed the Minister of Municipal ffairs and his Deputy relative to this matter, at which conference the following understanding was arrived at: viz:

"At a meeting held here (Victoria) today (Sept.18th) between the Commissioner, Collector and Solicitor of the Municipality of Burnaby, and the Hon, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and his Deputy, the situation as regards the District's 1935 tax sale was fully considered with particular reference to the disposal by tax sale proceedings of improved properties on which the enters reside and in respect of which, through stress of circumstances they have been unable to pay delinquent taxes and thus prevent the properties from going to sale. A general cancellation of the sale was not favoured but arrangements were made whereby those home owners who can not involved but arrangements were made whereby those nome owners who can satisfy the Municipal officials that they are in necessitous circumstances and are willing to perform work for the Municipality would still be given an opportunity of doing so under reasonable safeguards, to the end and extent that the amount earned for the services so rendered will be applied in payment of the 1955 taxes. As a condition precedent to the exercise of the right to work in this way those persons affected and designed to marine the right to work in this way those persons affected and desigous of availing themselves of the opportunity offered will be required to register with the District officials, giving such reasonable information as may be called for by them and herea ter if in receipt of relief toperform work for relief given. Opportunity will in such circumstances be afforded to work off the 1953 takes on the understanding that if such work is not satisfactorily performed or insofar as it is not performed tax sale proceed-ings will be resorted to on the 9th day of December n xt. In the meantime the tax sale will be adjourned from day to day until the date mentioned and so that no hardship may be suffered by other parties, the Collector will accept payment of the 1953 and later taxes from such p rsons up to the 9th of December next, allowing the authorized rebate of menalizes and interest of December next, allowing the authorized rebate of penalties and interest imposed. If necessary legislation validating the Municipality's acts will be enacted at the next Session of the Legislature.
