The Clerk submitted report on arrangement made with Park Assembly, Native Sons of Canada for the use of Fir Lodge, and recommended that formal notice be given to the Park Assembly that the existing arrangement will terminate as at May 31st. 1936, in order that the way may be cleared for future development of Central Park. "That the recommendation of the Clerk be adopted. Ordered:

The Clerk submitted a report on claim of A Hibak for compensation for road allowance of Mandeville Avenue, off Block 11, D.L. 166a, and advised that an amendment to the Highway act in 1922 (December) had declared all highways in existence and upon which public monies had been expended were declared to be public highways. As Mr. Hibak had purchased the property in 1929 and that the highway had been in actual use for many years prior to that date he was of the opinion that Hibak was entitled to no compensation, but in view of thefact that Hibak has been maying taxes on the portion of the property occupied by the road he be reimbursed in the sum of \$50.72, being amount of taxes levied against the portion so occupied, and trat he be requested to convey the southerly 33 feet of this block to this Corporation. The Treasurer concurred in the recommendation of the Clerk. Resolved: "That the recommendation of the Clerk be and is hereby adopted." ٧ The Treasurer advised that Mr.B.P.Scott - Works Superintendent - has been absent through illness since November 15th inst. and submitted a request from Mr.Scott for leave of absence to the end of the year. The Treasurer further advised that by arrangement Mr. J.G.Mill has been employed for a period of one month at a salary of \$125.00 and transportation to carry on during Mr.Scott's absence. Resolved: "That Mr.B.P.Scott be granted leave of absence to the 31st December 1935 and that appointment of Mr.Mill as Engineer on probation for a period of one month commencing Monday, November 25th inst. at a salary of \$125.00 be approved." The sitting then adjourned.
