John Minnie, 5920 Pandora Street, submitted complaint re noise nuisance from Associated Dairies located at the rear of his property.

The Honourable Provincial Secretary wrote that the Department would look with some alarm upon any move that would disrupt the service now provided by the Metropolitan Health Committee and that, should any move be undertaken and a separate service set up by any Unit within the Committee the grants to such a Unit would depend entirely upon the opinion of the Prov. Health Department as to the wisdeom of such a move.

Lt. John Wise, Executive Secretary, Disabled Veterans Association, wrote thanking the Council for the stand taken by them in respect of Widows' Pensions and enclosing copies of 'The Veterans' Betrayal'.

Moved by Cr. Hatherly, Seconded by Cr. Lewis: 'That the letter and booklets be received and acknowledged.' Carried unanimously.

Mrs. C. W. Oakley wrote on behalf of the Capitol Hill Community Hall requesting written verification that the Council will match dollar for dollar raised by them towards the building of a new community hall.

Moved by Cr. Hatherly, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: That this matter be table pending the reading of report by Committee re Douglas Road Branch Citizens That this matter be tabled Assn. Carried unanimously.

W. P. Philps, Assessor, wrote re salary and status of Mr. Norman Rogers, clerk in Assessor's office, and suggesting that he should be rated as a Clerk or be made Assistant Assessor with adequate remunderation.

Moved by Cr. Lewis, Seconded by Cr. Dingle: "That this matter be referred to the Personnel Committee." Carried unanimously.

The Building Inspector submitted report on the application of S.P. (b) The said Statement to be submitted to the Municipal Council on or before the 29th day of November, 1943.

"That a copy of this Resolution, Certified as such by the Municipal Clerk be forthwith sent to Messrs. Crehan, Meredith & Co., Official Municipal Auditors, respectfully requesting that they lend their cooperation in the matter, and for the information of the Municipal Council they be good enough to acknowledge receipt thereof."
