Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Dingle: \*\*WHEDEAS it is the opinion of this Council that adequate housing for wage earners families of the lower income groups cannot be provided for under Part I and II of the National Housing Act of 1944;
AND WHEREAS there are in Rinnipeg, according to the Census report of 1941, 9,457 wage earners families who have an annual income of less than \$950.00 AND WHEREAS our Sanitary and Housing Division reports show that a large number of wage earning families in Winnipeg are improperly housed, AND WHEREAS the report of the Dominion Advisory Committee on Reconstruction indicates that similar conditions exist in all the large urban centres in the country; NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Council request the Pominion Government to smend the National Housing Act of 1944 at the next session of parliament to provide for the following:
1. That urban municipalities be empowered to set up Housing Authorities for the purpose of constructing low-rent housing projects, with funds to be provided

by the Dominion Government at a low rate of interest. That the housing accommodation so provided be available for rent to lofumilies at 1/5 of their income, and that losses, if any, be borne by low income

AND BE IT FUPTHER PESOLVED: that this resolution be sent to all cities in Canada with a request to endorse same, and also that His Worship the Reeve be requested to submit this resolution for approval of the Executive of the Canadian Federation of Wayors at their forthcoming meeting. Carried unanimously.

Cr. Pall and Cr. Gartlan submitted a majority report on a resolution of the Canadian Legion Post 63 re Employment of Veterans as follows
"The Reeve and Councillors of Furnaby have given very careful consideration to the proposal of the Legion that all arranguments made for employment of personnel be

on a temporary basis on the understanding that they should be replaced by members of the armed services seeking employment. We concur fully with the motive which prompted the Legion to make this recommendation and our Council is prepared to cooperate to the utmost in rutting into effect all measures designed to secure the best possible treatment of veterans. We have already taken a position that any veteran who has been employed by the Council would be able to return to his job on discharge from the army with full seniority rights protected. We do not believe however that to accept the principal of all employment being of a temporary nature

until such time as veterans could be employed, would serve the best interest of the veterans themselves.

We take the view that such an arrangement would not only promote disorganization and lack of system but more important would create that division between workers at home and men in the armed services which could have very serious consequences detrimental to the war and detrimental to a satisfactory solution of post-war problems. Our Council takes the view that real security for the veterans which implies full employment, is only possible through policies which will provide jobs for every

citizen willing and able to work. If we were to hire men on the understanding that they were to be displaced immediately a veteran was found to take their place, we would be giving all our employees a sense of insecurity that would make it difficult for them to function properly. More than that, we would be open to the charge of promoting disunity between those sections of the people whose interests are identical for these reasons we do not believe we can concur with the recommendation of the Legion but wish to re-affirm our determination to press, through our Council, for all embracing Government measures which have full regard to employment requirements of returning veterans.
