

Monday - December 16th 1946

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds on Monday, December 16th 1946 at 7:30 P.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philips, Beamish, Gartlan, MacSorley and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the minutes of meetings of December 2nd and December 4th 1946 be adopted as written, and confirmed."
Carried Unanimously

Secretary, Edmonds & East Burnaby Progressive Conservative Assn. wrote submitting resolutions adopted by their organization in connection with establishment of a Post Office in the Municipality and improvements to roads in the East Burnaby District.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the letter be received and referred to the 1947 Council."
Carried Unanimously

President, Branch No. 12, Old Age Pensioners Organization wrote asking if the Council had any property, other than the McGregor Estate, which might be used as a home for the aged in view of recent developments by the Provincial Government to again use the McGregor Property as a Borstal Home.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received and the matter tabled until a reply to our latest communication to the Provincial Government in this connection, has been received."
Carried Unanimously

Attorney General wrote replying to our letter requesting invitation to public meetings to be held in connection with establishment of a Borstal Home in the McGregor Property, Marine Drive advising notification would be forthcoming.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the letter be received."
Carried Unanimously

City Clerk, New Westminster wrote acknowledging our communication in connection with Right-of-Way, Express Highway expressing appreciation for cooperation.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received."

Secretary, South West Burnaby Ratepayers Assn. wrote requesting that the drainage ditches on McKay Avenue near Victory St. be cleaned and extended.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received and the writer advised the Engineer has the matter in hand."
Carried Unanimously

Deputy Commissioner, B.C. Provincial Police wrote advising that renewal of the new policing contract effective January 1st 1947 would be subject to revision of rates from \$1,700.00 to \$2,078.59 per man and that the new contract figure on a proposed establishment of 17 men would be \$41,058.27

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That this matter be referred to the special committee already appointed to consider renewal of the contract."
Carried Unanimously

James R. McKenzie wrote advising the steering apparatus on his car had been damaged as a result of striking an obstruction at the intersection of Delta Ave. & Hastings St. on the road allowance, and submitted claim for damage sustained.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the claim be referred to a committee comprising the Clerk, Solicitor and Engineer for report."

Joe. McHale, President, Burnaby Civic Employees' Union wrote expressing appreciation for cooperation received from the 1946 Council in all negotiations carried out during the year.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received and acknowledged."
Carried Unanimously

Garfield A. King wrote with reference to request of his client Mrs. Edith M. Mackay to have cancelled a 66 foot highway running to the south of her property, Lots 9 & 10, D.L. 85 and requested views of the Council in this connection.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the matter be referred to a committee of Clerk, Engineer and Councillor for the Ward (Cr. Philps) for investigation and report."

Carried Unanimously

A.A. Milledge wrote requesting the Corporation to dedicate a lane to the rear of property abutting on Douglas Road between 11th and 12th Avenues, taking a 20 foot strip off Lots 4 and 45, Block 2, D.L. 28 for this purpose and creating four lots 79 x 154 which would be more saleable by reason of the suggested lane.

The Engineer recommended verbally that the suggestion put forth by Mr. Milledge be carried out.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted."

Westminster Trust Co. wrote on behalf of Canadian National Institute for the Blind requesting quit claim on Lot 1, Block 12, D.L. 173 presently owned by Mr. Mills, a blind man, since the property was found to be unsuitable;

Graham B. Ladner wrote advising of Jury's recommendations as result of recently held inquests in the Municipality:

- (1) That parking bay in front of the Municipal Hall, Burnaby be extended west to the entrance of No. 2 Burnaby Fire Hall
- (2) That steps be taken to check on all vehicles carrying lumber to insure that loads are properly secured by chain or cable ties, and equipped with proper bulkheads.
- (3) That suitable lighting be installed at all designated pedestrian crossings in the Municipality, and that yellow lines be kept in repair.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the recommendations be referred to the committees concerned."

Carried Unanimously

Provincial Health Officer submitted copies of regulations for the Sanitary Control of Industrial Camps and the Regulations Governing the Sanitation of Eating and Drinking Places with the request that they be given proper distribution.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the Unit Director be requested to report as to how these regulations will affect the Municipality."

Carried Unanimously

Secretary, School Board submitted the following resolution to the Council:

"That Council be advised that we have received tenders of approximately \$53,000.00 and suggest that in their plans they reserve an amount accordingly and also advise that we will in addition to the programme, depending on the speed of development of Willingdon Heights, will require an additional school in that district."

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the matter be referred back to the School Board for further explanation and clarification."

Carried Unanimously

Executive Director, Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities wrote submitting account for membership fees for the year 1947 and advising of plans for the coming year.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and the account paid."

Carried Unanimously

Social Assistance Administrator wrote advising the Provincial Government had authorized a Christmas Bonus for Social Assistance recipients on an 80%-20% basis and that the Corporations share would amount to \$450.00, requesting authority for this expenditure.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. West: "That authorization be granted as requested."

J.S.F. Jones wrote in connection with disagreeable odours emanating from the Shell Oil Co. Plant in North Burnaby advising many people in the Lechdale and Capitol Hill districts were complaining and requesting that the Clerk be instructed to write to the Company registering complaint.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the letter be received and the Clerk be instructed to communicate with the Company forwarding copy of Mr. Jones' letter."

Engineer submitted report on application of A.E.C. Holdings Ltd. to purchase Lots 19 to 30, 7 to 30, 7 to 18, Blocks 8, 9, 12, D.L. 68 Map 980 for the purpose of constructing 2 and 3 bedroom houses for the Central Housing and Mortgage Corporation advising that the property could be serviced adequately by water from Boundary Road and would require clearing, grading, gravelling and ditching of roads. Engineer also reported that installation of sewers in the area should receive consideration.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the matter be referred to a Special Committee for consideration."

Carried Unanimously
