

Monday - May 20th 1946

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds, on Monday, May 20th 1946 at 7:56 P.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philps, Beamish, Jones, Gartlan, MacSorley & Ball.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously

A. Harrison wrote advising he was willing to discuss with the Council the matter of amalgamation of Burnaby with Vancouver as suggested in a petition submitted for consideration previously.

Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and the writer advised the Council has no intentions in this connection at present."

Carried Unanimously

Secretary, Capitol Hill P.T.A. wrote endorsing action taken by the School Board in asking for better school conditions in the Municipality.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and acknowledged."

Carried Unanimously

Walter M. Girling wrote advising his wife had suffered a fall as a result of a defect in the sidewalk on Victory St.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the matter be referred to the Engineer and the writer be advised the Corporation can admit no liability for injuries suffered from the fall."

AMENDMENT

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the Engineer be instructed to have his foremen inspect all sidewalks and make repairs were necessary."

School Board submitted Extra-Ordinary estimate for approval as follows:

Architects' Fees, alterations to present school building, Nelson Avenue 900.00

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That Class "B" and "D" items be approved."

Carried - Cr. Beamish against.

Secretary, School Board submitted resolution suggesting that the Municipal Act be amended to make the By-law empowered by Section 101, Chapter 199, R.S.B.C. 1936 more effective, the by-law being a regulation to prevent children from being on the streets after nightfall. Following is the resolution:

RESOLVED: that this Board recommends that Section 101 of the "Municipal Act" being Chapter 199 R.S.B.C. 1936, be amended so as to provide for the possibility, in the Magistrate's discretion, of the imposition of a fine in a sufficient amount to act as a deterrent."

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the resolution be referred to the Committee on resolutions at the forthcoming Union of B.C. Municipalities conference."

Carried Unanimously

Geo. Culbert submitted application for reinstatement in the employ of the Corporation on his discharge from the Armed Forces.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the application be referred to the Reeve."

Carried Unanimously

Secretary, Lozells Ratepayers Assn. wrote requesting that a delegation be heard in connection with provision of transportation in the Lozells area. Delegation appeared.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the delegation be heard."

A.W. Ker spoke and requested that the Neville Transportation Co. be allowed to operate their approved route through that area or that transportation offered by other Bus Companies be allowed to commence without delay.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the delegation be thanked and that they be advised all possible is being done to provide necessary transportation for the Lozells area as well as other districts in the Municipality."

Carried-Crs. Beamish & Jones against.

Secretary, Burnaby Ratepayers Central Council wrote advising of a resolution passed by their Council that a full time Assessor should be employed to bring the Assessment roll up to date.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried - Cr. Beamish against.

Neville Transportation Co. submitted the following proposed routes for Council's approval together with fares to be put into effect on these routes:

1. North Burnaby to New Westminster via Lochdale and Caribou.
2. North-South service to Byrne Road-Marine Drive via Smith Ave..
3. Vancouver Heights to Barnet.
4. Extension of Vancouver Heights run to Capitol Hill.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Jones: "That Route No. 1 be approved and that the other routes be referred to a Committee of the Whole."

AMENDMENT

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That all routes be referred to a Committee of the Whole."

Carried - Crs. Beamish, Jones & MacSorley against.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the Council meet as a Committee of the Whole when discussing future Transportation matters."

Carried Unanimously

- 2 Philip Kravac re-applied for permission to convert a garage located on his property into a dwelling.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That former resolution, not to grant the application, be reaffirmed."

AMENDMENT

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the Burnaby Town Planning By-law be waived and the application be granted."

LOST In Favour: Crs. Ball & West

Against : Crs. Philips, Beamish, Jones, Gartlan & MacSorley

Original motion carried unanimously.

M. McBeath, Manager, Ocean View Burial Park Co. made application to landscape property at the South-East corner of Boundary Rd. & Kingsway and submitted an artists drawing of the proposed landscaping.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the matter be referred to the next Parks Committee meeting."

Carried Unanimously

C. Shish et al submitted petition to have Parker Street between Carleton Ave. and Boundary Rd. rolled and oiled.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the matter be referred to the Engineer to advise of the Corporations policy in this connection."

Carried Unanimously

- 3 W.C. Burchell wrote making application for waiver of the Burnaby Town Planning By-law to permit of the erection of a Beauty Salon on E. Pt. lot 11, Block 32, D.L. 152 - 2700 Block Royal Oak Ave.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the waiver be granted."

Carried Unanimously

Delegation from the International Woodworkers of America, Union Local 1-357 appeared.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously

George H. Mitchell spoke on behalf of the Union and requested endorsement by the Reeve and Council of their strike action and of the following resolution:

RESOLVED: That we call upon all Mayors, Reeves, Councillors, members of Legislative Assembly and Members of Parliament, to use their influence in an effort to bring the two parties in dispute together immediately in an attempt to effect a settlement as early as possible, to enable the workers to return to their jobs and produce the lumber to build the homes so badly needed in the present housing crisis.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the resolution be endorsed."

 - (a) That the 12" Bond Street main be lifted and replaced with a 16" main from Chesham to Inman Ave. and a 15" main from Inman to Halley.
 - (b) That the 12" main on Halley Street from Turner to Grange Street be lifted and relaid with a 15" main.
 - (c) That the 12" main on Grange Street, from the manhole east of Chaffey Avenue to Willingdon be lifted and be relaid with a 16" main.
 - (d) That a 10" main be laid on Willingdon Avenue from Grange St. to Kingsway parallel to existing main.

The Council met as a Committee of the Whole on Monday, May 13th 1946 and recommend:

1. That Mr. Copland be given a vote of confidence and that he be asked to carry on with his duties until such time as a full time assessor, suitable to the Council, can be procured, and that he be commended for the work that he has done.

FIREMEN'S CONCILIATION COMMITTEE

Your Committee met on May 14th 1946 and recommend:

1. That an increase of \$7.50 per month be granted to all firemen, including Deputy Fire Chief, retroactive to January 1st 1946.
 2. That the salary of the Fire Chief be increased to \$240.00 per month effective as from January 1st 1946.
 3. That promotions be left for consideration on the introduction of the new act covering the 48 hour week.
- Moved by Cr. Jones, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the recommendation of the Firemen's Conciliation Committee be adopted."

Cr. Beamish reported on application of R. McAllister to erect and operate a mink farm on Lot 5, Block 59, D.L. 136/136 and recommended that the application be not approved.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the application of R. McAllister be not approved."

2. Treasurer reported he had received approval of the Estimates of Expenditure for the year 1946 pursuant to the requirements of the Burnaby Debt Refunding Act, 1940 and that it would be in order for the Council to finally pass the 1946 estimates so approved.
- Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the report of the Treasurer be received."

3. The Engineer submitted report on application of D. McGillivray for water supply to Lot 1, Block 10, D.L. 40 and advised the applicant had been granted an easement to pipe the water from the Government Rd. main through Block 5, D.L. 40 and recommended permission be granted.
- Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted."

4. Cr. West reported that the Deaf & Dumb School on Marine Drive was being vacated and suggested that the premises might make a suitable home for the aged and requested the Provincial Government be approached to this end.
- Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the Clerk be instructed to write to the Provincial Secretary and request information as to their intentions with these buildings."

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That Burnaby Automatic Vending Machine By-law 1946 be now introduced and that the Council sit as a Committee of the Whole with the Reeve in the Chair to consider the By-law."

The Reeve then asks the question: "What is your pleasure with this By-law."
