

Monday - March 25th, 1946

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, March 25th, 1946 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philps, Beamish, Jones, Gartlan, MacSorley and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

David Pace et al submitted petition requesting that the lane be opened up between Balmoral and Inverness Streets from Griffiths Avenue.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the petition be received and this matter be referred to the Engineer for consideration."

Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Helen Harries wrote submitting complaint re the flood condition existing at 7332 Aubrey Street.

Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and filed and this matter be referred to the Engineer."

Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Helen Harries wrote submitting application for water service to 7332 Aubrey Street and also on behalf of Mrs. Katie Knonsack for water service to lot on corner of Aubrey Street and Burrard.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and this matter be referred to the Engineer for consideration."

Carried unanimously.

1 Executive Director, Children's Aid Society of Vancouver, wrote enclosing copy of their yearly statement showing the balance of maintenance owing by the Municipality of Burnaby for the year 1945 in the sum of \$1772.85 with the request that this account be paid.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter together with enclosures be received and filed and that the account be paid."

Carried unanimously.

2 C. C. Bell wrote submitting memorandum re widening of streets for the guidance of the Council in dealing with this question and advised that in his opinion if the Council passed their By-law establishing a building line to facilitate the future widening of any street in the Municipality, the property owners affected would have a claim against the Corporation.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and filed and a copy of the memorandum be supplied to each Councillor."

Carried Unanimously.

J. Stuart Burton, North Burnaby Parent Teachers' Association Study Group wrote inviting a representative from the Council to attend a meeting to be held on Tuesday, March 26th at 4172 Yale Street the object of the meeting being to discuss the question of Community Centres.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and Cr. Gartlan be requested to attend."

Carried unanimously.

3 Secretary, Burnaby School Board, wrote enclosing copy of letter received from the Principal of Kingsway West School relative to an accident occasioned from the pupils of that school using the right of way of the B.C. Electric as a shortcut to school and suggesting that the Council take steps to have a pathway constructed along the south side of the right-of-way from Patterson Avenue to Jubilee.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and the School Board be advised that the Council has no power to expend public monies on private property."

Carried unanimously.

T. P. Appleby, Re-Establishment Officer, wrote requesting that a member of the Council be appointed to act as representative on the Burnaby Citizens' Re-Establishment Committee.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and filed and Cr. West be appointed as representative of the Council."

Carried unanimously.

T. P. Appleby, Re-Establishment Officer, wrote requesting information as to the number of veterans of the 1939-45 war resident in Burnaby prior to enlistment who purchased property prior to the effective date of discount on sale of Tax Sale property.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and the writer advised that it is not possible to supply this information."

Carried unanimously.

1. R. G. Scott wrote advising that he had recently paid the sum of \$40.00 for sewer connection and that as the sewer connection had been installed at the time the main sewer was constructed he felt that he should not be required to pay the \$40.00 now requested but should be charged only the sum of \$25.00 being the amount of the sewer connection charge at the time the work was done and he therefore requested a refund of \$15.00
 Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Councillor Bahl: "That the letter be received and filed and that the writer be advised that the sewer connection is payable at the date the sewer connection is made use of and fees charged accordingly."

Carried - Cr. West voting against.

Secretary, Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association, submitted resolution re Housing passed at the Central Burnaby Housing Conference held in the Douglas Road School on February 26th, 1946
 Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the resolution be received and filed."

Carried Unanimously.

2. Secretary, Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association, wrote advising that grading of lower portion of Harwood Park had been completed and requesting that the Engineer be authorized to install a tile drain prior to April 15th in order that they may proceed with seeding.
 Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That an appropriation of \$200.00 be set up for work in Harwood Park pending bringing down of annual Estimates."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary, Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association, wrote requesting that consideration be given in the Estimates for 1946 for appropriating further money for development of Harwood Park.
 Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received and filed and this matter be referred to Committee on Estimates."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary, Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association, wrote requesting the use of one of the A.R.P. buildings to be transferred to Harwood Park.
 Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and Tabled and that a Committee be named to look into the matter of disposal of the A.R.P. buildings."

Carried unanimously.

3. A Committee consisting of Crs. Philps, Ball and Reeve Morrison was named.

R. D. McKilligan wrote submitting application for waiver of the Town Planning By-law to permit the use of a building at 2725 Roberts Street as a chicken house at a lesser distance than 50 feet from other buildings on the property.
 Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and this matter be referred to the Councillor for the Ward for consideration and recommendation."

Carried Unanimously.
