

Monday - December 15th 1947

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall Monday, on Monday December 15th 1947 at 9:42 A.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Beamish, Philips, MacSorley, Gartlan, Green and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Green, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That minutes of the previous meeting be accepted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:-

E.A. Tully wrote on behalf of his mother, Mrs. Ve Tully, making application for a waiver of the Burnaby Town Planning By-law to permit of the erection and operation of a store on Lot 3, Block 8, "L. 68NW.Pt. located on Boundary R." being property owned by Mrs. Ve Tully.
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the application be referred to the Councillor representing the District for consideration and recommendation."
Carried Unanimously

A. Johnstone wrote requesting opening of the lane leading to his property at 3833 Imperial Street asking that said lane be the only access to the property.
Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That this request be referred to the Engineer for report."
Carried Unanimously

Harry Forbes wrote requesting that action be taken to improve the north side of Kingsway in the 3800 Block alleging that the public is having difficulty in gaining access to the business premises in this block because of the hazardous condition existing.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That this matter be referred to the Engineer and Councillor representing the District."
Carried Unanimously

Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works wrote asking that the installation of the flasher light at the intersection of Kingsway and E. Mon Street must be carefully planned in connection with the widening of Kingsway, since the intersection is of an unusual nature, and that for this reason installation of the light should be left in abeyance at the present time.
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the Clerk be instructed to communicate with the District Engineer requesting that installation of this light be not delay pending widening of Kingsway."

Secretary, Public Utilities Commission wrote asking the increase in transportation fares to which the Commission had granted consent on a tentative basis applies only within the City of Vancouver.

Secretary-Treasurer, Leaside & District Community Assn. wrote requesting improvements to 18th Avenue in the 1800 Block, the bridge crossing the ditch at 16th Street and District Avenue and the dumping of garbage on the side road in the Leaside District.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That these requests be referred to the Engineer and Councillor representing the District."

C.C. Bell, Solicitor wrote with reference to E.R. Taylor Construction Co. agreement re gravel operations in Strick Pit asking there was no legal difficulty in the way whereby variations to the existing agreement would be barred but that the proposed variations should be embodied in a supplementary agreement and that in his opinion the Company should not be allowed to go right up to the deadline of March 31st 1948 before the question of prices for the remainder of 1948 is considered.
