The decision of a majority of the said Labour of Board shall be final and binding on all parties. The said Arbitration Board shall forthwith sit, hear the parties and their representatives and determine its award, and shall make and deliver ats award to the parties within fifteen days from the date the Chairman is named, or within such longer period as the parties may agree to.
