Telephone Company, wrote with regari to tell charges between New Westminster and Vanccuver, advising that before undertaking an involved and costly study to determine the necessary increases in exhange rentals which would accompany the elimination of the present toll charge, they would like to be assured that the three Councils of Vancouver, New Westminster and Burnaby are all of the opinion that there is some possibility of evolving a uniform rate structure that would be acceptable to the majority of subscribers and at the same time meet the additional costs of providing flat rate service over the whole area.
