

Monday - October 18th, 1948

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, October 18th, 1948 at 9:45 A.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philips, Beamish, Gartlan, MacSorley, McLean and Drummond.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:-

Secretary-Treasurer, Burnaby Fire Fighters Association, wrote with reference to the fourteen day suspension without pay awarded to fireman Leonard McEwen resulting from the collision between a Burnaby Fire Truck and a B.C.E.R. interurban at Fraser Arm and Gilley Avenue appealing the decision of the Committee of such suspension.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Drummond: "That the letter be received and the action of the Special Committee be endorsed."

Carried - Cr. West voting against.

Sales Manager, B.C. Electric Ry. Company, wrote with reference to our request that the installation of a street light at the intersection of Willingdon Avenue and the Grandview Highway be given top priority in so far as light installations in Burnaby are concerned advising that the light in question has now been installed pointing out that delays in the installation of street lights is occasioned by the inadequate supply of materials available and expressing the hope that there will not be too long a delay before our entire street lamp order is completed.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried Unanimously.

Crehan Meredith and Company, Accountants submitted their account, together with that of George A. Morison, Stenotype reporter, in the sum of \$270.10 in connection with appearances before the Public Utilities Commission Hearing regarding the enquiry into B.C.E.R. Company rates.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the account be paid as submitted."

Carried Unanimously.

President, Union of B.C. Municipalities, submitted circular relative to Municipal Bond issues outlining suggestions designed to assist the smaller Municipalities in obtaining a higher return for their bonds.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the circular be received and filed for future reference."

Carried Unanimously.

Secretary, Burnaby School Board, wrote submitting Extra-Ordinary, Estimates 1948 Class "E" for an additional sum of money required to complete the new Junior High School now under construction on the present Edmonds Street School site, owing to the fact that the actual tenders received exceeded the amount of money on hand - \$29,692.00, Less Government assistance 50% \$14,846.00 - Net Total Estimates Class "E", \$14,846.00

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Extra-Ordinary Estimates 1948 Class "E" be received and accepted."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the Municipal Clerk be instructed to bring down a By-law covering the amount of the Extra-Ordinary Estimates Class "E" out of Tax Sale Lands proceeds."

Carried Unanimously.

Letters were received from the North Burnaby Board of Trade, Willingdon Heights Ratepayers Association and the North Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce ~~xxxx~~ requesting the Council to approach the B.C.E.R. Company for immediate establishment of a Willingdon Heights bus service on the following route: From Boundary Road and Hastings Street, via Hastings Street, Gilmore Avenue South, William Street, Malison Avenue, Charles Street, Willingdon Avenue north to connect with the present Vancouver Heights bus and return.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That these letters be referred to the Standing Committee herein."

Carried Unanimously.

The Burnaby Hospital Society submitted resolutions respecting the following

1. That a plebiscite be placed before the electors in December for the purpose of ascertaining if the public are in favor of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby guaranteeing a Two hundred thousand dollar loan from the Provincial Government for the purpose of erecting and equipping a General Hospital in Burnaby, said loan to be repaid over a period of twelve years, by a special levy of one mill on the taxpayer.
2. That the sum of \$50,000.00 set aside by the Municipal Council for the purpose of constructing a Municipal Hospital in Burnaby be now transferred to the Burnaby Hospital Society.

3. That the Corporation of Burnaby deed to the Burnaby Hospital Society or dedicate same for the specific purpose of erecting a Burnaby General Hospital thereon, property situated on the Lougheed Highway at Phillips Avenue, describe as Block 11, O.L. 44/78, Blocks 131 to 136 and South 5 acres lettered "A", Sketch 4710, J.L. 59/136/137, containing approximately 17 acres

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. McLean: "That the various resolutions be received and referred to the Committee of the Whole for thorough consideration and that the legal aspects be inquired into before the meeting of the Committee of the Whole on Monday next at 2:30 P.M."

Carried Unanimously.

Magistrate George A. Grant wrote requesting that Miss Joan Lois Wilson be appointed Court Stenographer under the provisions of Chapter 199, Section 408 (1) of the Municipal Act in order to avoid the necessity of her being sworn in before each case. Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Drummond: "That the request of Magistrate Grant be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

F. Sapach, Secretary, Capitol Hill Citizens meeting wrote advising that resolutions had been adopted at a Public Meeting held in Capitol Hill demanding that (1) the Council implement the mandate from the people regarding Municipal ownership of transportation, (2) the Council give account of the agreement with the B.C.E.R. whereby the fares on the East Hastings extension were increased and (3) the P.U.C. make provision for re-opening of a public hearing regarding fare structure and the power lines on Boundary Rd.

Mr. Fraser Wilson attended and requested an interview.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Wilson spoke and elaborated on the resolutions as submitted.

Cr. Beamish, and other members of the Council, spoke explaining position of the Corporation on the various matters brought forward.

Moved by Cr. McLean, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received and the delegation be thanked for their attendance."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the B.C. Electric Railway Company be formally requested to remove street car extension on East Hastings Street and institute a modern bus service."

Amendment.
Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the motion be amended by adding thereto and that negotiations be carried out for the removal of the Wye at Hastings and Boundary in addition to removal of extension tracks."

F. A. Fines wrote making application for a building permit to erect a bowling alley on property described as Lot 28 and East 5' of Lot 29, Block 7, J.L. 121, in the 4200 Block Hastings Street (advising that as the building was to be quonset style construction he had been informed it would be necessary to secure the approval of the Municipal Council under the provisions of Section 13 of the Burnaby Town Planning Act.

The Building Inspector submitted report on the above application advising that the permit was withheld because the Burnaby Building By-law had no provision governing this type of structure and also that this building if permitted, would be the first of its type to be constructed within the Municipality.

Mr. Fines attended and explained some of the details in connection with the proposed structure.

Moved by Cr. McLean, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That permission be granted provided the applicant undertakes to construct a wall of at least 12 feet in height on the face and the rear of the building and that access doors be placed at the rear."

Carried Unanimously.

A delegation representing residents of Jent Avenue spoke requesting that action be taken to improve the condition of the lane located between Jent and Madison Avenues

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That this matter be referred to the Engineer."

Carried Unanimously.

The Building Inspector submitted report on the application of Alan F. Williamson for a permit to erect a garage on property described as Lot 24, S.O. "B", Block 1, J.L. 120, at a lesser distance from the property line than is required under the provisions of the Burnaby Town Planning By-law advising that in this case it was discovered that the concrete foundation for the said garage had been laid prior to a permit being taken out and recommended that the provisions of the Town Planning By-law be enforced

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the report be received and filed and the recommendation of the Building Inspector be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted recommendation that B.C. Electric Gas Plan No. 5950 be approved as follows, subject to the condition that all damage to existing roadways be the responsibility of the Company:

Proposed 3" gas Main 329' in length, on Royal Oak from Portland Street south 329'

Main to be laid 17' east of the west property line.

Proposed 631' extension of 2" gas main on McKee from Royal Oak east 582'

Main to be laid 17' north of the south property line.

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Beamish addressed the Council with reference to the staggered position of the sideroads entering 4th Street which had the effect of creating a double tight at each intersection along this street, and suggested that in order to eliminate this condition at the intersection of 16th Avenue and 4th Street, property located on the south east corner of 16th Ave. & 4th St. be reserved from sale pending preparation of a plan of a portion of roadway which would broaden the turns at this intersection using a portion of the said property for road purposes.
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That Lots 8,9,10, Blk. "D", S.D. "A", D.L. 28 be reserved from sale and that a plan of the proposed diversion be prepared, preparatory to road dedication."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Beamish addressed the Council farther advising that since improvements had been carried out on Loughed Highway, a dangerous traffic condition existed at the intersection of Loughed Highway and Government Rd. and suggested that the Department of Public Works be approached with a view to installation of a flasher light at this intersection.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. McLean: "That the Department of Public Works be approached with the request that a flasher light be installed at this intersection on the usual 50%-50% basis."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. McLean, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Engineer be instructed to contact the Automobile Club of B.C. with the request that street signs be placed at the intersection of Loughed Highway and North Road."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Beamish addressed the Council further recommending that as considerable building had taken place on Broadway west of North Road, a street light be ordered for installation at a point 800' west of North Road on Broadway, and further that as the road was in a bad state of repair, efforts be made to carry out extensive improvements.
 Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That a street light be ordered for installation 800' west of North Road on Broadway and the matter of improvements be referred to the Engineer to do all possible to improve this portion of road."

Secretary, Town Planning Commission submitted report on various matters referred to the Commission, as follows:

- (1) Application of Frank Paha to be permitted to erect a confectionery shop on Lot 12, Block 55, D.L. 98.
 As this area is adjacent to the Jubilee Commercial area which in the opinion of the Commission is of sufficient size to take care of the needs of the district, the granting of this application is not recommended.
- (2) Application of W. Powroznik and I. Doud for a permit to erect and operate a Drive-In-Restaurant on Lots 3&4, Blk. 5, D.L. 119.
 This property is situated on the south side of the Loughheed Highway at the junction with Douglas Road, and is outside of the Commercial area established east of this point. The commission are of the opinion that the present area is of sufficient size to accommodate the district and further that the establishment of such a business at this intersection would create an undesirable traffic hazard. The application is not therefore favourably entertained.
- (3) Application of Crystal Dairy Ltd. and K. G. Carlson for clarification of zoning as it affects Lots 45, 55, 65, Blk. 33, D.L. 34.
 This property is situated on Grange Street at the intersection with Kingsway and is zoned partially in Commercial zone and partially in Residential zone. The Commission recommend that this property be considered entirely Commercial.
- (4) Application of N.J. Pittson for permission to erect a roller rink with coffee bar on Lot 4, S.D. "A", Blk. 7, D.L. 125.
 This property is situated at the southwest corner of Loughheed Highway and Broadway and is in a residential area. The Commission feel that the establishment of such a business at this intersection is not in the best interests of the Municipality and would tend to create a traffic hazard on the Loughheed Highway. The application is therefore not favourably entertained.
- (5) Application of Wilson Johnston for re-zoning of south east part of Lot 2, Blocks 40/43, D.L. 159.
 This property is located on Marine Drive just east of Gilley Avenue. A Commercial building is located on the south side of Marine Drive at Gilley and the Commission do not consider it advisable to create an area on the North side. This property is considerably above the level of Marine Drive and an additional traffic hazard would be created by the establishment of business premises here. The application is therefore not favourably entertained.
- (6) Application to have the property on the south side of Stride Avenue east from 20th Street zoned as "Local Commercial". The Commission have carefully considered this application and recommend that Lots 16, 17, 18, Block 30, D.L. 53 be zoned as "Local Commercial".
- (7) Application of W. Derhouseoff to have Lots 20&21, Blk. 29, D.L. 121 zoned as Commercial.
 This property is situated on the north side of Parker Street west of Willington Ave. and as a commercial area has already been established in D.L. 120, which is of sufficient size to accommodate the district, the Commission do not recommend the re-zoning of this property.

Moved by Cr. McLean, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the recommendations of the Town Planning Commission be adopted."

Carried Unanimously

His Worship Reeve Morrison reported verbally on the proposal to change the times for holding committee and Council meetings, recommending that the matter be held in abeyance until after the New Year.
