Mr. Hill spoke requesting that immediate improvements be made to the flood gates at the foat of Tillicum Street, as during the present freshet, the water was inundating their plant at every high tide. Mr. Hill and Mr. Phillips also requested information as to who was responsibile for authorizing the removal of sand bags from the dyke after the 1948 freshet.

Engineer reported no provision had been made for repair of the flood gates by the Corporation, as it was expected the Fraser Valley Dyking Board would undertake this work, and further that no authority had been granted by the Corporation for removal of sandbags, and that every effort to prevent removal of same had been made.
