L. 121 in connection with the future development of the said property in the 4400 Block Hastings Street, recommending that their proposal be accepted subject to suitable arrangements being made with the Provincial Government with regard to the widening of Hastings Street. The Engineer reported further suggesting the division of costs between the Provincial Government and the Corporation, estimating the Corporation's share to be approximately \$6,000,00, not including compensation for the 20 foot strip on three lots.

Moved by Councillor Isberwood and seconded by Councillor Philps "That the report of the Engineer be received and this matter be referred to a committee of the Engineer and Chairman of Board of Works and Water Works Committee (Cr. MacSorky) for ponsideration along with Provincial Government authorities and report." Carried Unanimously.
