

Monday - April 2nd 1951

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds on Monday, April 2nd 1951 at 7:30 P.M.

Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Crs. Wilks, Philps, MacSorley, Armstrong, Charlton and Sergeant.

Moved by Cr. Wilks, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously

Borden Elliot Kelley Palmer & Sankey, Barristers & Solicitors wrote enclosing true copies of application of Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company to the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada, together with map filed therewith and Order of the Board No. 76290 dated March 22nd 1951..

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That the letter be received and acknowledged."

Carried Unanimously

R.G.Allen wrote protesting the enlargement of premises at 3756 Dundas Street with an addition designed to house a four roomed suite, advising the conversion of these premises was detrimental to his property, and requesting that steps be taken to halt this proposed construction.

Mr. Allen appeared and requested an interview.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That Mr. Allen be heard."

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Allen spoke elaborating on the points raised in his letter.

Moved by Cr. Wilks, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received, and this matter be referred to the Building Inspector for report."

Carried Unanimously

Robert A. Leslie wrote with reference to acceptance of his application for position of Junior Clerk, Engineering Department, advising due to unforeseen circumstances, he was unable to accept the appointment.

Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. Charlton: "That the letter be received."

Carried Unanimously

John J. Pope wrote making application for re-zoning of property described Block 23, D.L. 1, Sketch 4358 to "Commercial" to permit of the erection of an Auto Body Shop on the property (350 North Road)

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Charlton: "That the letter be received, and referred to the Town Planning Commission for consideration and recommendation."

Carried Unanimously

Secretary-Treasurer, Burnaby Ratepayers Council wrote requesting that copies of any Money By-laws be supplied to their organization as soon as prepared, in the future.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Armstrong: "That the Association be advised the Council is not able to comply with their request for submission of money By-laws."

Carried Unanimously

South Burnaby Board of Trade wrote advising they had been successful in getting the Express Association of Canada to agree to extend to a large area of the thickly populated area of Burnaby, the same free express delivery and pick-up service that the City of Vancouver enjoys, effective as from April 2nd 1951, enclosing a list of street boundaries of the free area, as contained in the official notice from the Association.

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Armstrong: "That the correspondence be received, and acknowledged, and the Board be congratulated on the effective work completed in this regard."

Carried Unanimously

P.E.Jones et al wrote with reference to the condition of drainage ditches on Nelson Avenue between Kingsway and Glen Streets, advising the ditches were of such depth and size, as to be a hazard to traffic and children, and requesting that steps be taken to have the ditches covered.

Mr. Jones appeared, and requested a hearing in this regard.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That Mr. Jones be heard."

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Jones spoke requesting that the subject ditch be attended to, pointing out that the ditch reached a depth of six feet in places, and carried heavy drainage from Kingsway and other side streets, pointing out further that the heavy volume of drainage was causing erosion to boulevards and roads, and was a hazard to children.

Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the petition be received, and this matter be referred to the Estimates Committee for consideration."

Carried Unanimously

E.E.Winch, M.L.A. wrote with reference to the matter of location of Cools in the Municipality advising he would utilize available opportunities on the Floor to present same, although he felt there would be little hope of any beneficial result therefrom, suggesting that steps be taken to transfer some of the Government owned land in Burnaby, which could fulfill a certain use at this time.

Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That the communication be received."

Carried Unanimously

Minister of Lands wrote with regard to the proposed erection of a fence surrounding the sports area at Central Park, advising that since this was a public park, and the area surrounding the park was becoming more thickly populated, it was not considered to be in the best interests of the public to allow the fencing of this Park.  
Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That the letter be received, and referred to the Reeve."

Carried Unanimously

Canadian Legion, Branch 83 (South Burnaby) wrote requesting information as to what action was being taken to acquire the strip of land to complete the lane allowance, servicing their property, and that of store owners on Kingsway at Royal Oak Avenue.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Sargent: "That the Clerk be instructed to determine the costs which would be involved in the expropriation of this land."

Carried Unanimously

Bull, Housser, Tupper, Ray Guy & Merritt, Barristers & Solicitors, wrote with reference to damage to property of Mr. Robert Fisher and Mr. Thomas McInquire as a result of the flooding of Mr. Fishers property at 7284 Inlet Drive, advising they were now in a position to estimate the damage in this connection, at \$1480.87, and requesting that the Council reconsider its stand of non liability in this case, or authorize its solicitor to accept service of their Writ on its behalf.  
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Sargent: "That the letter be received, and liability be disclaimed, and that the Solicitor be instructed to accept service of Writ in this regard."

Carried Unanimously

Fraser Valley Municipal Association wrote with reference to a letter received from the District of Surrey, dealing with the recent Circular No. 205P/149M from the Deputy Minister of Welfare, with regard to proposed increases in Social Allowance, advising this matter was to be discussed at the forthcoming meeting of the Association, and requesting that relevant figures be available for discussion purposes.  
Moved by Cr. Wilks, Seconded by Cr. Charlton: "That the letter be received and delegates to the meeting note the request for information to be taken to the meeting."

Carried Unanimously

City Clerk, City of Vancouver wrote advising of the proposal to set up a Metropolitan Industrial Development Commission, and that the first step in this direction was to appoint a committee to go into details of organization, representation etc. requesting that a suitable representative be appointed to the said committee to meeting with similar representatives of other municipalities in the metropolitan area.  
Moved by Cr. Wilks, Seconded by Cr. Armstrong: "That the letter be received, and the Reeve be appointed as representative of this Council on the proposed Committee."

Carried Unanimously

W.J.A. Lemay wrote with reference to condition of a building and garage located at 4661 Kingsway advising that the building had been condemned by the Building Department due to the inadequacy of the wiring, and also the garage which was in need of improvement, requesting that he be granted a permit to carry out the necessary alterations to the buildings, and also at the same time, he be granted a trades license to operate the property commercially for the sale of art work.  
Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the application be referred to the Building Inspector for report."

Carried Unanimously

Chairman, North Fraser Harbour Commission wrote making application for use of the foreshore on the North Arm of the Fraser River, advising they were in a position to offer a yearly rental of \$100.00 per year for the use of this foreshore for boating ground, advising further they would be willing to relinquish any part of the property if required for Industrial purposes by the Municipality. Chairman also mentioned they may be able to assist in the matter of obtaining dredging material, when available, to build up the foreshore upland, should it be required.  
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Armstrong: "That the letter be received, and this matter be referred to a special committee to take up further with the North Fraser Harbour Commissioners."

Carried Unanimously

Committee appointed included His Worship, Reeve Beamish, the Municipal Clerk and Municipal Solicitor.

Shell Oil Co. wrote with reference to their recent purchase of Lot 11, Block 1, D.L. 151/3, Plan 1662 for the purpose of erecting a multiple island automotive service station, requesting approval of the removal of three light standards shown on the blueprint submitted with their application, and also approval of pavement of the approaches to the property.

Mr. D.E. Carmichael attended and requested an interview  
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That Mr. Carmichael be heard."

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Carmichael spoke in support of the Shell Oil Co. application, advising there would be sufficient light from the operation of the service station, to replace the light which would be removed with the three standards in question. Moved by Cr. Sargent, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That the application be received, and be placed in the hands of the standing Street Lighting Committee and the Engineer for consideration and report."

Carried Unanimously

Secretary, Capitol Hill Ratepayers Association wrote requesting permission to clear the brush from park area in D.L. 189, known as Harbourview Park, as a preparatory step to the development of this area for special affairs, and playground. Representative appeared and requested a hearing.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That the representative be heard."

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Drummond spoke advising it was the desire of the Association to make an early start on the project, and requested that the necessary permission be granted.

Moved by Cr. Armstrong, Seconded by Cr. Wilks: "That approval be granted as requested."

Carried Unanimously

Cr. Philps spoke with reference to recent press statements indicating that Burnaby was not in favour of construction of an express highway between New Westminster and Vancouver, pointing out that such statements were erroneous, and that the Council had never been officially consulted relative to the matter, and had receive no information as to plans covering this project, suggesting that this matter be referred to His Worship the Reeve to take up with the Minister of Public Works. Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the matter of the Express Highway between New Westminster and Vancouver be referred to His Worwhip Reeve Beamish to discuss with the Honourable, The Minister of Public Works during his next visit to Victoria."

Carried Unanimously

(a) re: Building Inspectors Assistants -

First 6 months - \$230.00 per month

6 to 12 months - 240.00 do

Over one year - 255.00 do

(b) Add: Office Boy - \$100 per month - \$90.00 first 6 months.

(c) re: Cost of Living bonus - substitute the following: "If and when the Cost of Living Index increases by four points \$1.40 per week shall be added to the above basic rates. If the Cost of Living Index is reduced by four points, the basic rates shall remain unchanged and a reduction of \$1.40 per 4 points per week shall apply only to increases received under the Cost of Living clause in this wage schedule.

Cost of living bonus to be retroactive to the first day of the month following the month for which the Cost of Living figures are released, and to be calculated on the Vancouver Index."

- (d) Add: "The Council agrees to have a job survey conducted by Mr. Peterson, Personnel Manager for the City of Vancouver, said survey to be completed by November 1st 1951. In the event the services of Mr. Peterson are unobtainable, the Council will decide on a competent authority to conduct such survey.

Starting rates on all monthly jobs to be \$25.00 less than the basic rate set for each job, excepting the categories of Foreman, Building Inspector Assistants, Janitor and Office Boy.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the recommendations of the Committee be adopted."

Special Committee appointed to investigate the recommendation of the Social Assistance Administrator with reference to the job category of Mr. C. R. - (c) Application of Williams Construction Coy. to be permitted to prospect for gravel in the area north of Broadway and west of North Road and south of Curtis Street. Recommendation that approval be granted subject to the applicant indemnifying the Corporation for any or all accidents which might occur through his operations, and subject to a guarantee that all holes dug by him be filled to the satisfaction of the Municipal Engineer.
